

Bayard Rustin, Says Jew In a Delicate Situation

A leading figure in the Negro civil rights movement has warned that Jews are in a delicate and dangerous situation because of mounting Negro frustration in the struggle for racial equality.

Bayard Rustin, organizer of the 1963 March on Washington, made the statement at a forum on Negro-Jewish relations sponsored by the Conference on Jewish Social Studies. Proceedings of the conference appeared in the latest issue of Jewish Social Studies, a quarterly journal devoted to contemporary and historical aspects of Jewish life.

In his conference paper, Rustin said Negroes were "tired, desperate and fed up" at the lack of pro-

gress in ending racial segregation. "In such a situation of desperation," he said, "... they will attack violently. They will also attack Negroes with whom they do not feel they have empathy." He continued:

"When Jews think they are being singled out, that every little incident that occurs must be interpreted as some rise of Hitlerism, they understand neither the nature nor the complexity of the problem."

Rustin noted that strong criticism had been voiced by Negroes even against such civil rights leaders as Roy Wilkins, James Farmer and the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. "This is the way men behave when they are desperate," he declared, adding:

"It is most likely that they will next jump on Jews, who historically have been friendly to them. He does not understand this, does not understand the psychology of people in motion."

Another contributor to the discussion—Abraham G. Duker, an editor of the journal and professor of history at Yeshiva University—said that "demands for 'Negroization' of Harlem stores are viewed by some Jews as too sim-

ilar to 'Aryanization' propaganda of Germany."

Dr. Duker charged that "more and greater demands are being made by Negro leadership on the Jewish community than on the Christian denominations which surely should be closer to the Negroes because of their adherence to the same religious faith."

He called for "a frank and honest Negro-Jewish dialogue" but warned that this could not be achieved "unless some Jewish spokesmen free themselves of their masochistic approach to their own people and Negro leaders begin to react to black racism as they would like to see white persons react to white racism."

"Regrettably," he added, "anti-Semitic and genocidal Negro extremists have been given respectability and recognition as leaders by legitimate Negro leaders and intellectuals."

"This is what appened to anti-Semites in Germany, and the world is still paying for it."

Other participants in the discussion whose papers were published in Jewish Social Studies included Horace Mann Bond, dean of the school of education of Atlanta University; Howard M. Brotz of Smith College; David Caplovitz, University of Chicago; Sigmond Diamond, Columbia University; Bea Halpern, Brandeis University; Cleveland Robinson, nat'l vice president of the Negro American Labor Council; Morris Schappes, editor of Jewish Currents; and Leo Srole, professor sociology at the Downstate Medical College.
