
Surgeon General Warns of The Danger of Having Measles

The survey, reported in Modern Medicine, showed that of 400 private practioners questioned about half did not consider common measles serious enough to warrant routine immunization. Further, a large number of the interviewees felt that children should contract the disease in order to develop natural immunity.

"If we are to be successful in the conquest of common measles parents of small children must be fully convinced that measles is a serious dis-


