Father Divine Succumbs After Lengthy Illness in Philadelphia

PHILADELPHIA — Father Divine died last Friday in his palatial mansion after a long heart ailment that left him bedridden. According to beliefs of the followers of the Father Divine movement no funeral will be held.

The world wide followers of all races revered to Father Divine as God. According to Austin Norris, lawyer for 22 years for Father Divine, Divine was in the neighborhood of 100 years old.

Father Divine died penniless although he lived in luxury. The controlled properties consisting of hotels and cult-run businesses such as beauty parlors and restaurants were valued at about \$10 million. Norris also revealed that the estimated value of Father Divine's Philadelphia area empire has a gross value of \$2.5 million. Norris stated, "He died without a cent belonging to him. He never had to pay any income tax."

The multi-million dollar interracial cult will continue under

the leadership of the white widow, Mother Divine. She will carry on with the cult founded by Father Divine on the basis of communal living, celibacy and personal honesty — with hours of feasting around a banquet table, the main theme of his religion.

Mother Divine is the lone survivor of the 5-foot 2, billiard-bald, cherubic cult leader. He married the white Canadian secretly in 1946, when she was only 21 years old.

The uncounted followers of Father Divine referred to him as God. About one-fourth of the followers are white.

Father Divine's opinion of the subject can be summed up in his thought:

"I don't have to say I'm God and I don't have to say I'm not god. I said there are thousands of people who call me god. Millions of them and there are millions of them who call me the devil. And I don't say I am god and I don't say I am the devil. But I produce god and shake the earth with it."
