RICHMOND - Two civil ights organizations last week asked the Fourth U. S. Circuit

Court of Appeals here to over turn a lower court's refusal to enjoin Baltimore police from searching private buildings without first obtaining search warrants. NAACP Legal Defense and

Educational Fund lawyers along with attorneys for the Baltimore NAACP brought the appeal in behalf of seven Baltimore Negroes. The suit is a class action in

behalf of all Negroes similarly situated. It stems from an inensive police manhunt a year ago for two Negro brothers suspected of the Christmas Eve holdup of a liquor store




