Historical Sketch of Mutual Savings & Loan

Mutual Savings and Loan Association, formerly Mutual Building and Loan Association, was organized Jan. 25, 1921 with assets of approximately \$425 by the late R. L. McDougald and originally operated out of one window in Mechanics and Farmers Bank.

The first president of Mutual Savings was Charles Clinton Spaulding, Sr., who served from 1921 until his death Aug. 1, 1952. Also a co-founder of North Carolina Mutual, Spaulding was a guiding light during the association's early years.

Frank Lawrence McCoy, who was born in Danville, Va., and earlier was a practicing chiropractor, was the first secretary of Mutual Savings, serving from 1921 until Jan. 21, 1936 when he retired from full-time service and became chairman of the board. He remained as board chairman until his death on May 11, 1951.

E. R. Merrick succeeded Mr. Spaulding as president in 1952 and continued until 1962. A retired vice president and treasurer of North Carolina Mutual, Mr. Merrick is now chairman of the association's board of directors.

The association's roster of charter members is as follows: C. C. Spaulding, Sr., R. L. McDougald, Dr. A. M. Moore, J. M. Avery, E. W. Cannady, W. Wilson, F. L. McCoy, J. L. Cooper, George P. Holloway, Sam Wolfe, and W. J. Kennedy Jr. Mr. Kennedy is the only living charter member and serves on the board and as a director.

The first state-chartered association in Durham to join the Federal Home Loan Bank and Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation, the association has participated in the financing of numerous developments in Durham and Orange Counties. During World War II it purchased and served as an issuing agent for U. S. Savings Bonds.
