

**ATLANTA MAN NAMED REO OFFICER FOR REGION THREE**

ATLANTA, Ga. — Federal Highway Administrator Rex M. Whitton announced the appointment of Alexander D. Gaither of Atlanta, Ga., as Regional Equal Opportunity Officer for the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads Region 3.

He will be in charge of the Bureau's equal job opportunity program, as required by the 1964 Civil Rights Act, in a seven-State region comprising

Tennessee, North Carolina, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida. The region's headquarters are in Atlanta.

The program is designed to assure equal employment opportunity on Federally-aided highway projects, regardless of race, color, creed or national origin. He will be responsible for conducting compliance reviews, investigating complaints, and encouraging State highway

departments and road contractors to take affirmative steps to implement the program.

The Bureau of Public Roads headed by Mr. Whitton, is a unit of the U. S. Department of Commerce, which administers a nationwide \$4 billion Federal-aid highway program.

A graduate of Knoxville College in 1932 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree, Gaither received his Master of Arts Degree from Ohio State University in 1938. He also studied at the University of Tennessee and Tennessee State University.

greenery and red roses around candelabra holding white candles.

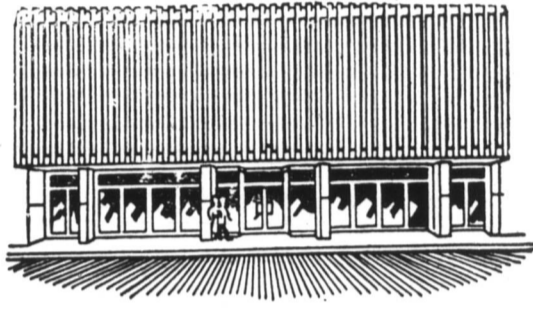

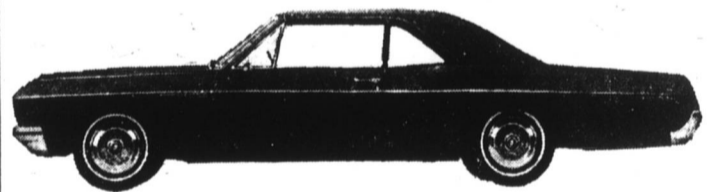

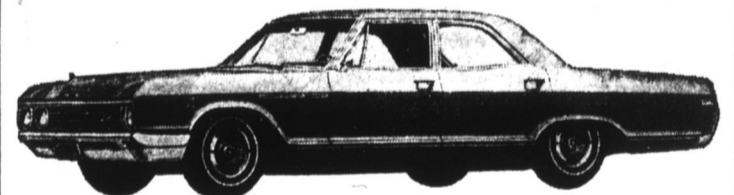
