### Georgia Candidate May Sue Democrat Party

ATLANTA, Georgia—Rev. C. A. Samples, who was disqualified as a candidate for representative from the 134th District to the General Assembly of Georgia, issued a militant statement at a press conference held at the Georgia State Capitol Building.

Reverend Samples went to the State Capitol to qualify for the race on Tuesday, June 14. He completed a qualification blank and an affidavit in the presence of his advisors. When a photostatic copy of his affidavit was brought to him, Reverend Samples noticed that all of the affidavit was not on the copy. Later he was told that he was disqualified because he had been convicted of violations of the criminal laws of several states.

At the press conference, Rev. Samples accused the secretary of the state Democratic Party, Travis Stewart, of publicly defaming him and withholding with malicious intent the fact that the violations attributed to him were dismissed. In Rev. Samples' point of view, Stewart acted as the Judge and the Executioner. He demanded that Stewart publicly retract the malicious statements made against his good name and good character.

Rev. Samples went on to criticize the Democratic Party. He stated that the party was not concerned with the welfare of the poor and the black people. He concludes that the Georgia Democratic party prefers the Ku Klux Klan to the Black Man since "It is more acceptable in Georgia for Calvin Craig, a member of a subversive organization and Lester Maddox who has been cited for contempt of federal court order to seek office. There is no objection to the legislature being composed of known white nationalists. But at the same time they want the Black Man to die in foreign wars in the name of 'freedom.' According to Rev. Samples, there is the possibility of organizing a third party that will try to fit the needs of these people in this state.

### Jesse L. Allen is Men's Day Speaker at Mt. Gilead Church

Jesse L. Allen, business education teacher at Hillside High School for the past nine years, served as guest speaker for the 11:00 A.M. worship service. He was presented by Earlie Vanhook. University, and Duke University.

From the latter institution he was awarded the Master of Education degree in school administration, September 1, 1965. He was elected to the office of "Historian" of the Alpha Tau Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, honorary society in education, for the 1966-67 school year.

Allen was awarded a two-year Southern Education Foundation fellowship to pursue a doctor's degree in school administration at Duke. He resigned his teaching position at Hillside to meet the S. E. F.'s requirement that all fellowship recipients must become full-time students. John H. Lucas, Principal of Hillside High School named him the Outstanding Young Educator at Hillside for the 1965-66 school year.

He is a member of Mt. Gilead Baptist Church and has served as teacher and Assistant Superintendent in the Sunday School. Allen is married to the former Miss Constance V. Glenn of Spartanburg, South Carolina and they have one child—Jennifer Lauren.

The Men's Day Program was climaxed with panel discussion at 6:30 p.m. J. T. Tucker, member of the Trustee Board, served as moderator for the panel. The topic discussed was "Is God Dead?" Panelists were Deacon Levi Mitchell, Supt. of the Sunday School, B. B. Rogers, Financial Secretary, and Deacon Hezekiah Ruffin, Director of the B. T. U.

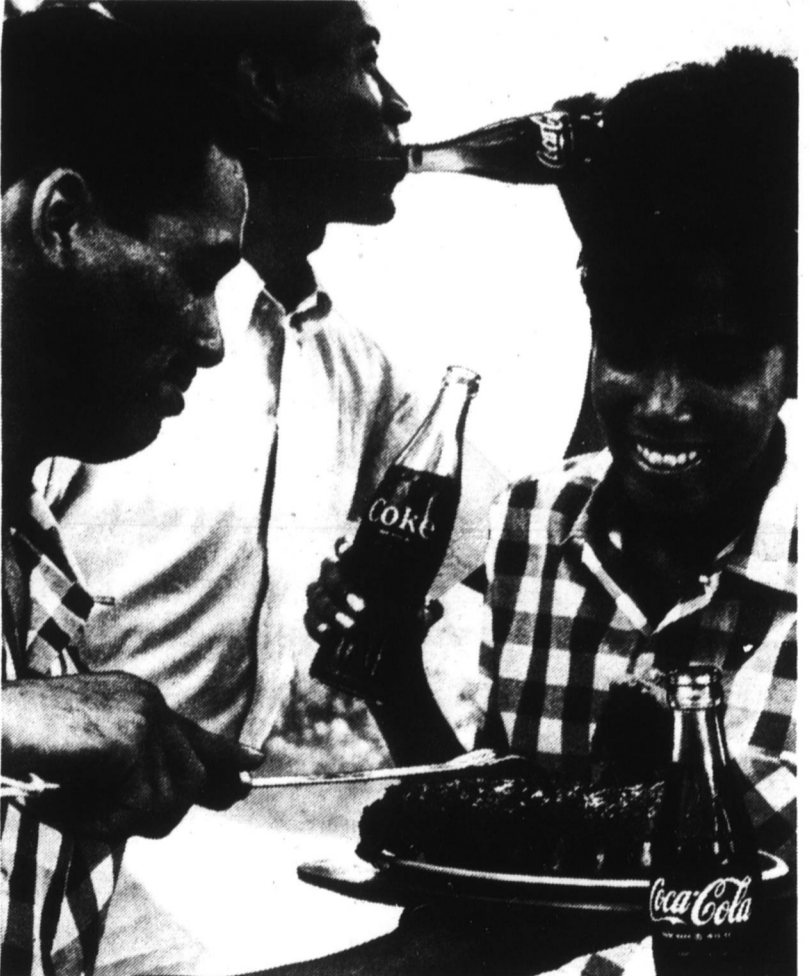

### 99 Scholarships Given Negroes In Med Schools

Ninety-nine grants to Negro students who will attend medical school in 1966-67 were announced recently by Dr. Franklin C. McLean, Secretary-Treasurer and Founder of National Medical Fellowships, Inc., and Visiting Professor, Department of Histology, University of Illinois. This is the largest number of awards made by National Medical Fellowships, Inc. in its 20-year history. The winners of the 1966-67 scholarships and grants-in-aid will study at 51 U. S. medical schools, including 14 Southern medical schools.

Commenting on this year's program, Dr. McLean said, "With this year's admission of Negroes into the Medical College of Alabama, Louisiana State University, and Vanderbilt University, all but one or two of the Southern medical schools have now opened their doors to Negro students. It is no longer a problem for the qualified Negro to find a medical school but rather for the medical students are mmmabmbd Negro students. At present only about 3 per cent of all medical students are Negro. All of our efforts are bent on seeking ways to increase this number."

Ten of the awards are the prized four-year National Medical-Sloan Foundation Scholarships, made to outstanding Negro students entering medical school. Beginning in September, 1966, these students will study at Columbia University, The Johns Hopkins University, Loma Linda University, Louisiana State University, New Jersey College of Medicine, Northwestern University, Ohio State University, University of Pittsburgh, Stanford University and Vanderbilt University.
