IBM Planning Open House For April 22

munications - the sending and receiving of information for computer systems - Will be featured by IBM in the Research Triangle Park at a community Open House

Plans for the day long event were announced today by General Manager Arthur L. Becker. The plant and laboratory will be open for public tours from 9 a.m.

"The Open House is one of the few opportunities we have to show our company the community," Becker said. "I hope every one will take the opportuni ty to visit us during the day."

Announcement of the Open House falls almost two years to the day from the announcement that IBM would build a center for the manufacture and development of data communication products in North Carolina.

The 605,000 square-foot complex was finished in January and contains the atest developments in data communications. Displays in the laboratory will feature some of the advanced communication techniques developed by local scientists and engineers, while manufacturing displays will concentrate on the company's current line of products built for use with System/360 computers.

Tours guides will be available to answer questions. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. No pets are allowed in the buildings.

The Open House will follow a Thursday dedication in which Governor Dan K. former Governor Moore, Luther H. Hodges, and Thomas J. Watson, Jr., IBM Chairman of the Board, will address an estimated 4,000 guests, employees and their families.
