Pre-Schoolers Need To Know Their Numbers
 Pre-school children should be taught two sets of numbers before they go to school — their number and their telephone number. Not only should they know them, says Ann Leinn Gibson, Extension Home Economist, but they should be given the opportunity to tell them to adults.

This is just a precautionary measure, in case they do become lost. It's wise, too, for parents to help them recognize the type of adult they should look for to give this information to — the policeman, the uniformed guard, the manager of a store, the clerk behind the counter.

Telling him in a matter-of-fact way, what to do if he ever found that he's lost track of you in a store, for instance, prepares him to cope with such a situation if it ever arises. It may make the possibility less frightening for him, too. Especially if you practice it at home in a play situation.

Teach him to state his name and address and ask that his parents be reached. Then, that he is to stay put until you come for him. Playing this many times at home may help him learn the routine to go through without making it frightening.
