Carve Like a **Master Chef**

Newly developed cordless electric carving knives make carving and slicing of meat, poultry and other foods easier and fun no longer a job only for experts. Professional results can be had by following a few simple rules

Chef Mario Tanzi of the Anters Restaurant on New York's Wall Street, tells and shows how to carve two of the most common meats - roast turkey and ribs of beef.

ROAST TURKEY


