Dentists Denounce Racial Policy In North Carolina

WINSTON-SALMÉ, N. C. — Negro dentists are not coming to practice in North Carolina because of the racial composition of its state examining board and because of the high rate of failure of out-of-state dentists on board tests.

Members of the Old North State Dental Society reached his conclusion recently at their annual meeting at the Hotel Robert E. Lee. More than half the state's 90 Negro dentists attended the convention.

DR. Spurgeon W. Webber of Charlotte, chairman of

the committee on recruitment, reported that no Negro has been admitted to the University of North Carolina Dental School in Chapel Hill, N. C. He also noted that his committee could not find Negroes who wanted to attend this school.

"More than 50 per cent of graduates of out-of-state schools fail the State Board of Dental Examination," he said. He recommended that the state adopt a reciprocal program with other states in approving dentists who pass tests in other states that accept those who pass in North

Carolina.

ONLY one Negro dentist set up practice in North Carolina for the first time during the past year, Dr. Harold M. Holt in Greensboro.

Dr. O. R. Stovall of Goldsboro was elected president of the Society. Other officers are: Dr. S. W. Webber, vice president; Dr. Kermit E. White, Elizabeth City, secretary-treasurer; Dr. C. B. Jones, Jr., Elizabeth City, assistant secretary-treasurer, and Dr. J. C. Owens, Roxboro, state vice-president to the National Dental Association.

Members of the Board of Directors are: Dr. J. B. Rosemond, Wilson; Dr. J. E. Campbell, Durham; and Dr. G. E. Butler, Fayetteville, three-year terms, and Dr. J. P. Stinson, Charlotte, two-year term.

The society called for continued support of the all-Negro group although Negro dentists are now accepted by the North Carolina Dental Society.

The convention will meet in Raleigh in 1968.

Rahway, N. J. Names Negro Police Chief

RAHWAY, N. J. — The State of New Jersey got its fourth Negro chief of police when Herbert T. Kinch recently assumed the post in Rahway, an industrial city of about 27,000.

Chief Kinch became a patrolman in 1942 and was appointed sergeant in 1953. A year later he was lieutenant, captain in 1959, and deputy chief in 1965.

At 51 he becomes the first Negro police chief in northern New Jersey. Manchester Township, Lawnside and Palmyra, all South Jersey communities have Negro chiefs of police.

He was a honor graduate of Virginia State College in 1939 and later served in the Navy in World War I.

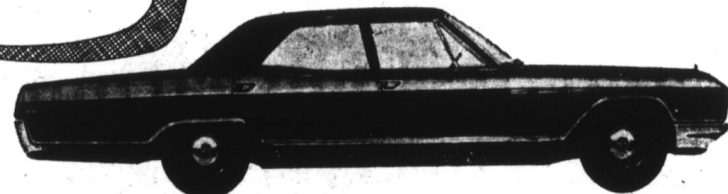
Basement target shooters can muffle the sound of their rifles or pistols by firing through a pair of plywood boards lined with acoustical tile suspended from the cellar ceiling.
