Answers questions about Junior Miss etiquette, grooming and interests.

Q. Mom leaped all over me again today because my room is a mess. She puts things where I can't find them and I can never remember where to put them back. I pick up my room every Saturday, but it just naturally seems to get messed up again. Besides, I don't see why the fuss — it's my room.

A. Sure, it's your room! But your room is part of the family's home! When one room is a mess, it's just as though you got dressed for a formal party, but wore a dirty, old loafer on the left foot. You need to plan the best way to keep your room in order. Next Saturday when you clean decide on a place to keep everything. Make a list of "keeping places" then promise yourself you'll put things away when you're through with them — immediately! Organize your closet and drawers and throw or give away anything you haven't used for ages. It's easier to put shoes, purses, hats, lingerie, gloves or scarves away if each has a special nook that's pretty too. A. We love 'em too! And you're right — they should be immaculate for every wearing. The ready-when-you-need-them trick is never to put your gloves back in the drawer after you've worn them. Wash them as soon as possible — it only takes a minute or two. For quicker drying, try this: After washing, roll them in a towel, unroll and shake out. Then stuff a Kleenex tissue or two in the palm of each glove. This helps the air circulate through the fabric — makes for jiffy drying!
