CSC Opens Information Office in Jacksonville

ATLANTA — The Civil Service Commission announced plans this week to establish a civil service information and examining office at the U. S. Post Office in Jacksonville, N. C.

The new office will function in connection with the Interagency Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, 415 West Hillsborough Street, Raleigh, North Carolina 27603 to provide information about Federal employment opportunities and conduct civil service examinations.

The Commission, upon the recommendation of Weston H. Willis, Postmaster, U. S. Post Office and was selected from designated Mrs. Mildred T. Twyman to be the Civil Service Examiner-in-Charge of the new office. Mrs. Twyman is a career employee of the Jacksonville, North Carolina Post Office and was selected from among several candidates for the position.

The new office is one of several such offices located throughout North Carolina to provide convenient locations where citizens may obtain information and be treated for civil service positions. The Jacksonville, North Carolina Office will maintain information concerning civil service examination announcements for positions in Federal agencies and installations located in N. C. and other states. Similar offices in North Carolina are located at Post Offices in Asheville; Charlotte; Durham; Elizabeth City; Fayetteville; Gastonia; Goldsboro; Greensboro; Greenville; Hickory; New Bern; North Wilkesboro; Raleigh; Rocky Mount; Salisbury; Sylva; Washington; Wilmington; and

Openings Now Available in Merch. Marines

KINGS POINT, N. Y. — The United States Merchant Marine Academy desires to inform qualified young Negro men of the opportunities available to them at the Academy and in the United States Merchant Marine.

The Academy, operated by the Maritime Administration of the United States Department of Commerce, is located on Long Island Sound at Kings Point, New York, about twenty miles from New York City. The Academy educates and trains young men for careers as deck or engineering officers in the Merchant Marine through a four year college curriculum leading to the Bachelor of Science degree. In addition to receiving a degree and a license as third officer or third assistant engineer, graduates may be granted a Commission as Ensign, United States Naval Reserve, by the Department of the Navy.

Candidates for admission must be nominated by a Congressman or Senator, but appointments are made on the basis of candidates' competitive standing within the state from which nominated. Competitive standing is determined by College Board Examination scores, high school rank in class, and subjective evaluation of candidates' leadership potential and motivation. Men desiring admission to the Academy with the class entering in July 1968 should request nomination by a Senator or Congressman as early as possible beginning September 1, 1967 and not later than January 31, 1968.

We have had numerous Negro graduates from the Academy and eight Negro cadets are presently enrolled. We hope that interest in Kings Point will continue to grow among young Negro men and that your organization will assist us in informing young Negroes of the opportunity available to them. Therefore, we ask your help in urging qualified young men in your area to request nominations as candidates for appointment to the United States Merchant Marine Academy and eight Negro cadets.
