ASCS Programs Play Big Role In Success of Virginia Farmer

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Assistance in establishing a pond for watering his cattle and irrigating his tobacco, aid in planting trees for controlling erosion and providing a long-term cash crop, and a loan toward the purchase of a bin for storing grain for his livestock or for price support are some of the ways the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture has helped farmer Alvin Rice of Freeman, Va., to succeed.

His first one-year term as a community committeeman is ending as the September election date in Virginia approaches. However, he is a nominee for re-election.

Mr. Rice began farming 11 years ago after he became tired of commuting 97 miles each way to and from the Portsmouth Navy yard where he was a machinist's helper. But farming was not new to him. He was reared on a farm where he and his brothers helped their parents with the crops.

So effectively has Mr. Rice used this assistance and other ASCS aid in improving his farm and increasing his income that his neighbors have not only increased their participation in ASCS programs, but have elected him as one of their Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) community committeemen.

In this position, Mr. Rice helps to keep his neighbors informed on farm programs, advises his ASC county committee on local farming conditions, recommends measures likely to obtain the best farm program results, and helps to elect county committeemen.

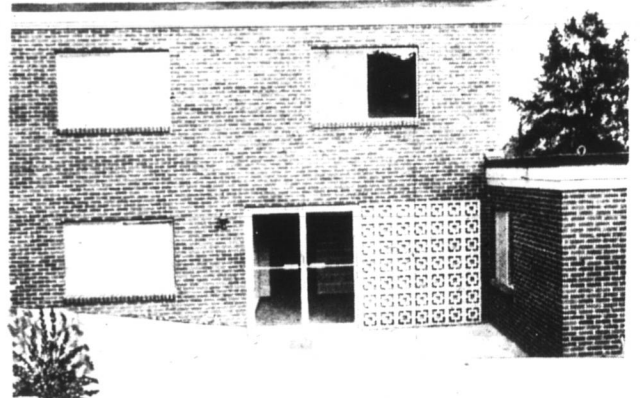

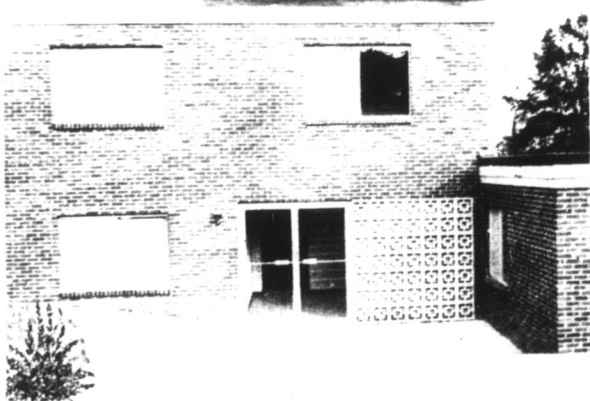

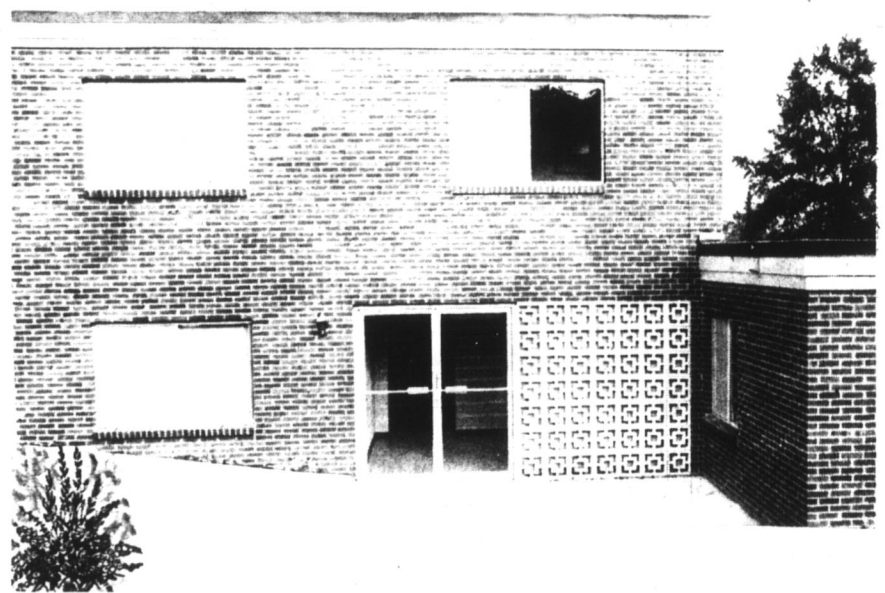
