## Fisher Memorial Minister to Observe 23rd Year

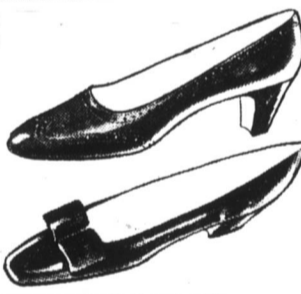
