(Baptist Church) has the oversight and superintendence of all the interests of the church, and all departments of its work, both spiritual and temporal. (See Hiscox page 97 paragraph 2).

Any deacon or any other member other than the pastor of the church who calls or attempts to call a meeting of the church is out of order and the meeting is not legal; and that member or members should be called in question by the church and pastor. No one has the right to call a meeting of the church except the pastor; all call meetings must be given at least one week's public notice, and the purpose of such meeting must be stated and the pastor shall preside in all meetings of the church according to Churchbook by Gaines S. Dobbins, A.M., Th.D., D.D., L.L.D., former Dean, School of Religious Education, Southern Baptist Theelogical Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. (See Dobbins Churchbook page 13, article 2.)

Trustees likewise to the deacons have no power at any time to act in any way until granted by the church through a vote by a majority of the members in a regular church meeting. 
