Five Civil Rights Workers Freed; Charges Lifted

LEXINGTON, Ky.—Kentucky officials have failed to appeal a U.S. court ruling that the state sedition law violates the First Amendment to the U. S. Constitution.

This means that the Sept. 14 decision of a three-judge federal court stands. Five civil rights and poverty workers arrested under it are freed of charges against them.

The five are Alan and Margaret McSurely, Pikeville, Ky.; Joseph Mulloy, Virgie, Ky.; and Carl and Anne Braden, Louisville. The Bradens are executive directors of the Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF), an interracial group working all over the South.

The McSurelys are mountain organizers for SCEF and Mulloy is field director in Pike County for the Appalachian Volunteers (AVs). The AVs do community work among the poor in the mountains and have helped in the fight to stop strip-miners from ruining the mountains.

The McSurelys and Mulloy were arrested at their homes on Aug. 11 and 12 by raiding parties led by State's Attorney Thomas Ratliff. Ratliff, who is also the Republican candidate for lieutenant governor, seized books, papers, and other personal belongings of the accused.

On Sept. 11 the Pike County grand jury indicted the McSurelys, Mulloy, and the Bradens on sedition charges. The law had been voided in 1956 in another case involving the Bradens, but Ratliff said the 1956 decision did not cover sedition against Pike County.

The federal judges, by a vote of 2 to 1, said they could not see how a person could commit sedition against a state or county "without in part overthrowing the government of the United States."

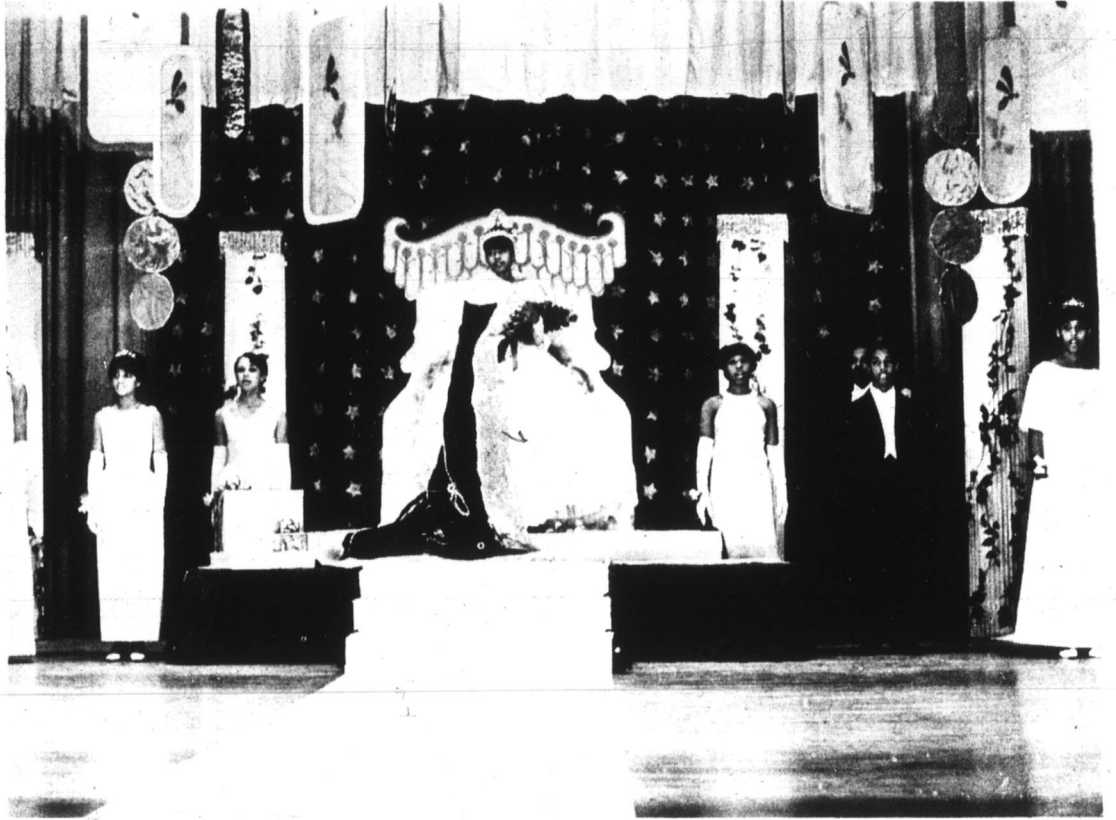

SUPREME COURT ASKED TO HALT EVASION SOUTHERN SCHOOL BIAS

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Supreme Court was asked last week to halt evasion by southern school boards of integration, the resistance pattern that has emerged since the days of "absolute defiance."

NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, (LDF) attorneys told the high court in their brief against the Board of Commissioners of Jackson, Tenn., that school segregation is still rampant across the south.

"During the 1966-67 year, a full twelve years after Brown (1954) Supreme Court school integration ruling, more than 90 per cent of the almost three million Negro pupils in the 11 south-
