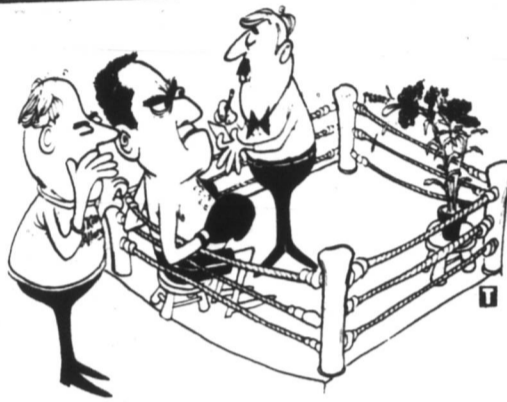

ANNUAL BATTLE AGAINST HAY FEVER IS ON

Just what is hay fever? The usual meaning is an allergic reaction of the nasal and upper respiratory passages to a wide variety of air-borne pollens or fungi. Symptoms may be most pronounced during the spring, summer, or fall, depending on the particular season and the pollen or fungi involved. Other substances, such as animal hair, feathers, the dusty back shelves of libraries, even the house cat of the family next door, may produce identical symptoms, but these, of course, are not typically seasonal.

To most persons, it means cold-like symptoms that overwhelm victims of pollen during a period extending from early or mid-August to the first hard frost.

It is during this late-summer early-autumn period that the big daddy of all hay fever causes, pollen from ragweed, becomes air-borne and fills the atmosphere of both countryside and city.

Close behind ragweed as a leading cause of the characteristic sneezing and wheezing of hay fever victims is golden rod.

The victims are afflicted by watering eyes, reddened noses and a general air of misery. Years ago the almost only effective step a hay fever victim could take consisted of booking passage on a liner scheduled to cruise the fjords of Norway.

But modern science, while it has not been able to remove the causes of hay fever, has devised alleviating agents for symptoms of allergy. Science has gone even further, and provided inoculations for allergies, but most persons depend on anti-histamines for relief.

The Northern War—Marines Hang On—Casualties High—Russians Guns Increase—

Washington, D.C.—In the month of September U.S. Marines hanging on at the American fortress of Con Thien, just below the so-called demilitarized zone, suffered more than a thousand casualties. Yet the prospect is for even heavier shelling and missile attack. Russia is promising Hanoi more and more weapons.

The Soviet Union has already supplied the enemy thousands of artillery pieces and more are coming. The Marines continue to cling to the Con Thien fort because it bars the path of invasion from the north. The American reply to the heavy shelling from mortars, rockets and conventional artillery has been counter-bombardment and aerial strikes.

But though the Communist barrage has been somewhat suppressed at times it has never been completely checked because weapons are moved in at night and moved next day and because new weapons are constantly being added.

(The U.S. command views the possibility of an invasion by North Vietnamese regulars seriously and it is said some four enemy divisions are massed just north of the zone.)

Most of the Russian arms arrive in North Vietnam through the port of Haiphong and if U.S. casualties continue at their present pace, or rise, pressure for a strike on the harbor will mount. The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and others have already strongly recommended the port be put out of action.

WINNING WAYS WITH WINDOWS

When you design your window wardrobe, remember that draperies can cloak architectural defects as well as decorate your room dramatically.

(1) For two windows far apart on one wall, avoid the look of single pairs of curtains. Instead, conceal the wall separating the windows with a ready-made drapery hanging straight. Use the same ready-made for over draperies at the window, tied back. Sheer underdraperies of fiber glass complete this pretty-as-a-picture window.

(2) Glass walls or picture windows can present the problem of too much light and too little privacy, but you can overcome this in high style!
