

DR. THEODORE SPEIGNER NAMED TO EXECUTIVE BOARD OF NCGE

Dr. Theodore R. Speigner, Chairman of the Department of Geography at North Carolina College, was elected to the executive board of the National Council for Geographic Education at its fifty-third annual meeting on November 25 at the Conrad Hilton Hotel, Chicago, Illinois. He will hold the office through 1970.

Others elected to the executive board were Dr. Lawrence M. Somers, chairman of the Department of Geography, Michigan State University; Dr. Robert A. Harper, chairman of the Department of Geography, the University of Maryland; and Dr. Edward A. Fernald of Florida State University, Tallahassee.

Dr. Daniel Jacobson, professor of geography at Michigan State University, was elected president of the organization for 1967-68. Elected first vice president was Dr. Benjamin F. Richardson, chairman of the Department of Geography at Carroll College, Waukesha, Wisconsin. Dr. William D. Pattison, associate professor of geography at the University of Chicago, was elected second vice president.

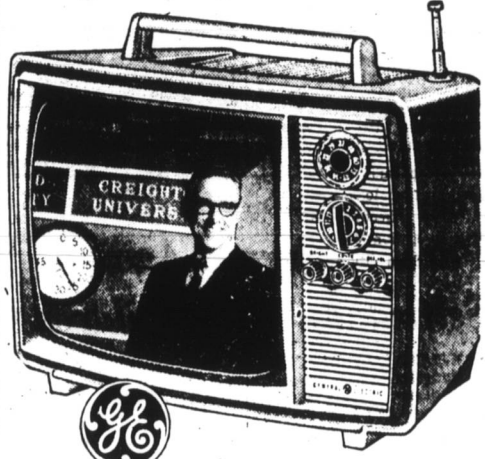
Dr. Speigner attended the annual convention of Gamma Theta Upsilon National Geographic Honor Society, which convened at the same time as the National Council for Geographic Education.

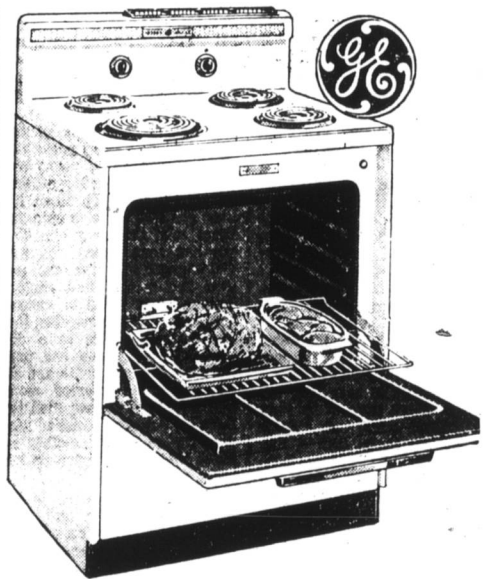

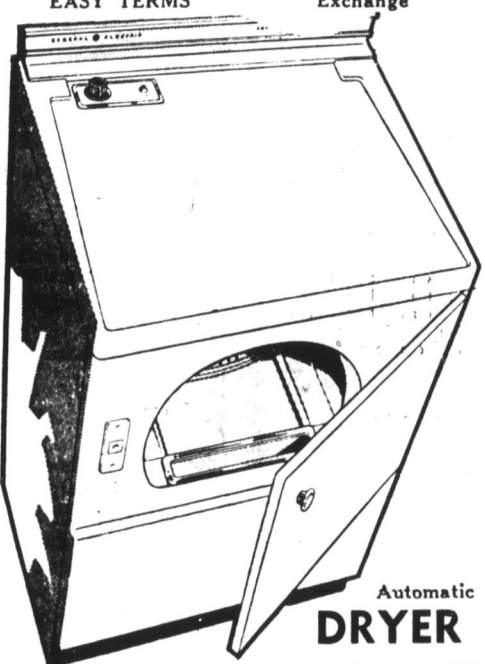

NAACP Seeks to Register 600,000 Texans for Vote

HOUSTON, Texas—A goal of 600,000 registered Negro voters in Texas by the close of the two-month registration period, Jan. 31, 1968, has been set by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

The campaign, under supervision of W. C. Patton, associate director of the NAACP Voter Education Project, will be kicked off at a mass meeting in the Rice Hotel, Sunday, Dec. 3. This will be the opening rally for the campaign in the Southern part of the state. The following Sunday, Dec. 10 a similar rally will be held in the Adolphus Hotel in Dallas to launch the drive in northern Texas.

To conduct the statewide drive, Mr. Patton has called for 2,000 volunteers working out of the state's 57 NAACP branches. Each branch has been asked to appoint a campaign chairman and a director to organize the door-to-door canvassing in their respective areas.

The Rev. O. L. Herman of Fort Worth, the Association's state chairman for church work, will co-ordinate efforts to enlist the support of the clergy throughout Texas. The pastors have been asked to urge members of their congregations not only to register but also to become volunteers to get others to perform this civic duty.

Fully-staffed offices will be opened in 11 key localities each with a director and other personnel. Dr. Richard Jones, Jr., will head the office in Amarillo; Mrs. Lillie Mae Shaw in Victoria and Mrs. Mary Wadley in Austin. Others will be designated directors of offices to be opened in Beaumont, Corpus Christi, Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston, Longview, San Antonio and Texarkana.

Commenting on the up-coming campaign, Mr. Patton said: "We have come a long way in the South, but still have a long way ahead. In 1956, there were only 1,236,550 registered Negro voters in the region. We now have about 2,806,000. In the past, white politicians thumbed their noses at Negro voters, but today, even in the most remote areas of the Deep South, they are seeking the Negro vote."

Under Texas law, all voters must re-register periodically. The present drive is to get Negro voters re-registered and to add new names to the voters' list.

The Routing On The Hillsborough Rd. End Will Be As Follows:

From Five Points—west on Main Street to Duke Street; north on Duke Street to Green Street; west on Green Street to Ninth Street; south on Ninth Street to Hillsborough Road; west on Hillsborough Road to Englewood Avenue; east on Englewood Avenue to Alabama Avenue; north on Alabama Avenue to Club Boulevard; east on Club Boulevard to Oakland Avenue; south on Oakland Avenue to Hillsborough Road; east on Hillsborough Road to Ninth Street; north on Ninth Street to Green Street; east on Green Street to Gregson Street; south on Gregson Street to Main Street; east on Main Street to Five Points.

The Routing On The Driver Ave. End Will Be As Follows:

From Five Points—east on E. Main Street to Alston Avenue; north on Alston Avenue to Morning Glory Avenue; east on Morning Glory Avenue to Hyde Park Avenue; north on Hyde Park Avenue to Taylor Street; east on Taylor Street to Driver Street; north on Driver Street to Liberty Street; east on Liberty Street to Guthrie Avenue; south on Guthrie Avenue to Main Street; west on Main Street to Driver Street; north on Driver Street to Taylor Street; west on Taylor Street to Hyde Park Avenue; south on Hyde Park Avenue to Morning Glory Avenue; west on Morning Glory Avenue to Alston Avenue; south on Alston Avenue to Main Street; west on Main Street to Five Points.

NOTE: For eight trips each day (7:34, 7:52, 8:19 and 9:46 A.M. and 12:46, 1:46, 3:46 and 5:22 P.M.) this bus will be routed as follows: From Taylor Street and Guthrie Avenue; east on Taylor Street to Gary Street; south on Gary Street to E. Main Street; west on E. Main Street to Guthrie Avenue, south on Guthrie Avenue to Ashe St., west on Ashe St. to Driver St. and north on Driver St. to Taylor St. (On Saturday five trips will leave Gary and Taylor Streets at 8:15, 9:18, 10:00, 11:56 A.M. and 1:28 and 4:52 P.M.)
