

Staff Members of Senate Summoned for Meet

LEXINGTON, Ky.—Attorneys for the Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF) summoned staff members of a U.S. Senate subcommittee to a hearing here Dec. 5. They also demanded that records of the subcommittee be produced in court.

The hearing was conducted by a three-judge panel in U.S. District Court. The purpose was to decide whether the subcommittee, headed by Sen. John McClellan of Arkansas, should have access to records seized when two SCEF employees were arrested last summer.

Alan and Margaret McSurely, organizers for SCEF, and Joseph Mulloy of the Appalachian Volunteers were charged with sedition after raids on their mountain homes last August. The three-judge court killed the state sedition law but documents seized in the raids were held pending final disposition

of the case.

The McSurely and Mulloy papers were subpoenaed by the McClellan Committee a month after the court decision. McClellan said he had sworn testimony that ghetto uprisings in Nashville, Tenn., were "instigated, precipitated, or encouraged" by SCEF, the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), and the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC).

SCEF attorneys want the staff of the committee to present any evidence they have to back up this statement. Among those they are summoning to testify is Jerome Adelman, Washington, chief counsel for the McClellan Committee.

They also summoned Thomas Ratliff, prosecuting attorney, Pikeville, Ky., where the raids and arrests took place. Ratliff was ordered to bring along any docu-

ments relating to the charges of the McClellan Committee.

Also subpoenaed were records of a meeting of the Pike County Fiscal Court. SCEF attorneys charged that the plan to seize the documents was worked out there on the afternoon before the raids. The attorneys were Dan Jack Combs, Pikeville, Ky.; William M. Kunster and Arthur Kinoy, New York; and Morton Stavis, Newark, N. J.

(Continued from front page) the South are being given to the McClellan Committee's distorted interpretation of the clashes between black people and police in Houston, Nashville and other cities.

The board declared that Sen. John McClellan's investigation of uprisings in U.S. cities is becoming like those of the House Un-American Activities Committee (HUAC) and the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee (SISS), headed by Sen. James Eastland of Mississippi. The board noted that HUAC and SISS seek to find scapegoats to blame for problems instead of looking for the real causes and cures.

It was especially critical of Eastland's announced plan to investigate the MFDP and the National Conference for New Politics (NCNP). SCEF affirmed its opposition to the war in Vietnam and criticized government officials for changing the draft status of young men who protest against the war.

correct a problem involving race until it is confronted directly and dramatically. It required a Selma before the fundamental right to vote was written into the federal statutes. It took a Birmingham before the government moved to open doors of public accommodations to all human beings. What we need is a new kind of Selma or Birmingham to dramatize the economic plight of the Negro and compel the government to act. In the final analysis, SCLC decided to go to Washington because, if we did not act, we would be abdicating our responsibilities as an organization committed to nonviolence and freedom. We are keeping that commitment and we shall call on America to join us in our forthcoming Washington campaign."
