

DR. LLOYD C. ELAM NAMED NEW HEAD OF MEHARRY MED. COLLEGE

NASHVILLE, Tennessee — Dr. Lloyd Charles Elam last week was named president of Meharry Medical College at the semi-annual meeting of the Meharry Board of Trustees.

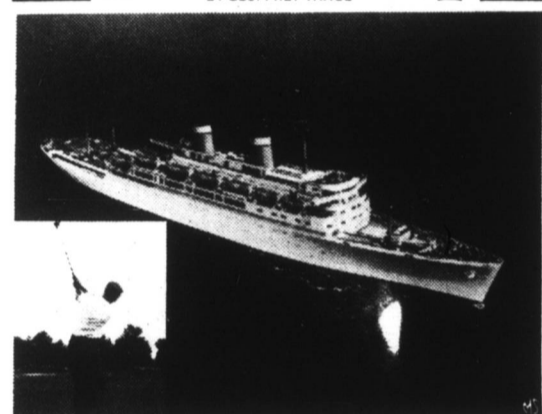
