Q.—Several years ago I elected to receive Army retirement benefits rather than VA disability compensation. Is it too late to change now?

A.-No. There is no deadline for a current election of com pensation in lieu of retired pay However, you must undergo a VA medical examination to determine the degree and nature of your disability and the amount of compensation to which you are entitled. You can make arrangements for this examination through your nearest Veterans Administration

Q.—I am receiving a pension as a widow of a veteran and for our two children. I am considering marrying again. If I remarry will I lose this pen-

A. - Your pension will be terminated but your children will continue to receive benefits if neither has an unearned income exceeding \$1,800 per year. Children do not lose their rights to a pension when the widow remarries or dies. They will continue to receive a pension until they reach 18 or, if they remain in school, until age 23. The rate for two children together is \$56 per month. Where there is only one child the rate is \$40.

Q.—I entered active duty last year under the Six-Month Reserve training program and I served 182 days during this tour. Am I eligible for schooling under the G.I. Bill?

A.—No. The fact that you had the required minimum of 181 days in service does not apply in your case. Veterans who enlisted under the Six-

Income Tax Receipts Up For State

Income tax was the big producer as North Carolina's General Fund revenue collections last month showed an increase of \$2.9 million over the same month last year.

State Revenue Commissioner I. L. Clayton reported to Governor Moore on Wednesday that the General Fund took in \$59.6 million in November.

Income tax receipts for the month amounted to \$30.2 million, a gain of \$2.6 million over November, 1966. The sales tax brought in \$17.9 million, an increase of \$228,000.

For the first five months of this fiscal year, the General Fund collected \$254.4 million, an increase of \$18.6 million over the same period a year ago.



Many Have Been Given **Good Jobs**

Program Operates In Nine Major Cities Of Nation

WASHINGTON - Nearly 5,000 disadvantaged persons— mostly Negroes — have been trained and placed in jobs through a "self-help program launched almost four years ago by a Philadelphia minis-ter.

The program is the Opportunities Industrialization Centers (OIC) now operating in nine major areas across the nation and the founder is the Rcv. Leon Sullivan.

NEARLY 20,000 residents of city ghettos have entered the nine major centers and, in addition to those already placed in jobs, 4,500 others are currently undergoing

Still others have been re-ferred to appropriate agencies cepted immediate employ-ment or dropped out of the program

THE OIC program is covered in depth in a U. S. Department of Labor monograph, federally-supported manpower activities throughout the

Philadelphia, the first of the centers, is the largest. In three and a half years of operation, 3,600 persons have been placed in jobs, with 98

persons enrolled in the Phila-delphia program, and there's a waiting list of some 6,000. The 3,600 newly employed

workers, says the monograph "are now adding more than \$8 million annually to the pur-chasing power of the city.." The cost of training each per-son is about \$900. ALL TOLD, there are 60 in-

Training courses vary with each locale, but typical are office practices, IBM keypunch, brickmasonry, machine maintenance, restaurant practices and commercial

recruitment, counseling, reand job placement.
