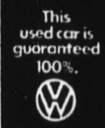

Vets Questions and Answers

Editor's Note: Below are the authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q.—Several years ago I elected to receive Army retirement benefits rather than VA disability compensation. Is it too late to change now?

A.—No. There is no deadline for a current election of compensation in lieu of retired pay. However, you must undergo a VA medical examination to determine the degree and nature of your disability and the amount of compensation to which you are entitled. You can make arrangements for this examination through your nearest Veterans Administration office.

Q.—I am receiving a pension as a widow of a veteran and for our two children. I am considering marrying again. If I remarry will I lose this pension?

A.—Your pension will be terminated but your children will continue to receive benefits if neither has an unearned income exceeding \$1,800 per year. Children do not lose their rights to a pension when the widow remarries or dies. They will continue to receive a pension until they reach 18 or, if they remain in school, until age 23. The rate for two children together is \$56 per month. Where there is only one child the rate is \$40.

Q.—I entered active duty last year under the Six-Month Reserve training program and I served 182 days during this tour. Am I eligible for schooling under the G.I. Bill?

A.—No. The fact that you had the required minimum of 181 days in service does not apply in your case. Veterans who enlisted under the Six-

Month Reserve program do not qualify under the G. I. Bill.

NEW YORK — The newly formed Negro Ensemble Company, which received a large Ford Foundation grant, will start its first season on Jan. 2 at its permanent home, the St. Marks Playhouse. Four plays will be presented.

THE OPENING attraction will be "The Song of Lushian Boyey," marking the American premiere of this work by Peter Weiss, author of "Marat/Sade." The setting is an African colony. It will be played through Feb. 4th.

There will be a Feb. 20 opening for Ray Lawler's "The Summer of the Seventeenth Doll," which was produced on Broadway several years ago. In this production, the locale will be shifted from Australia to the world of migratory Negro sugar cane workers in Louisiana.

Many Have Been Given Good Jobs

Program Operates In Nine Major Cities Of Nation

WASHINGTON — Nearly 5,000 disadvantaged persons—mostly Negroes—have been trained and placed in jobs through a "self-help program launched almost four years ago by a Philadelphia minister.

The program is the Opportunities Industrialization Centers (OIC) now operating in nine major areas across the nation and the founder is the Rev. Leon Sullivan.

NEARLY 20,000 residents of city ghettos have entered the nine major centers and, in addition to those already placed in jobs, 4,500 others are currently undergoing training.

Still others have been referred to appropriate agencies for special assistance, accepted immediate employment or dropped out of the program.

THE OIC program is covered in depth in a U. S. Department of Labor monograph, fourth of a series focusing on federally-supported manpower activities throughout the country.

Philadelphia, the first of the centers, is the largest. In three and a half years of operation, 3,600 persons have been placed in jobs, with 98 per cent landing jobs in their skill areas.

THERE ARE currently 1,400 persons enrolled in the Philadelphia program, and there's a waiting list of some 6,000. The 3,600 newly employed workers, says the monograph, "are now adding more than \$8 million annually to the purchasing power of the city."

ALL TOLD, there are 60 independent and active centers, including the major ones in Philadelphia, Erie and Harrisburg, Pa.; Roanoke, Va.; Washington, D. C.; Menlo Park, Calif.; Seattle, Wash.; Little Rock, Ark.; and Oklahoma City, Okla.

Training courses vary with each locale, but typical are office practices, IBM key-punch, brickmasonry, machine maintenance, restaurant practices and commercial cooking.

THE OIC program, begun in an old jailhouse in the heart of North Philadelphia's main poverty section, consists of recruitment, counseling, remediation, vocational training and job placement.

IN POLAND, children are visited by the Good Stars of heaven. The Mother Star is a lovely woman in white robe and veil, and the Father Star brings gifts to children who say their prayers and sing their hymns to his satisfaction. Christmas Eve itself is called the Festival of the Star.

Income Tax Receipts Up For State

Income tax was the big producer as North Carolina's General Fund revenue collections last month showed an increase of \$2.9 million over the same month last year.

State Revenue Commissioner I. L. Clayton reported to Governor Moore on Wednesday that the General Fund took in \$39.6 million in November.

Income tax receipts for the month amounted to \$30.2 million, a gain of \$2.6 million over November, 1966. The sales tax brought in \$17.9 million, an increase of \$328,000.

Clayton said Highway Fund collections during November totaled \$14.2 million, up \$1.6 million.

For the first five months of this fiscal year, the General Fund collected \$254.4 million, an increase of \$18.6 million over the same period a year ago.
