Dr. Benjamin Mays Gives Black Power's Definition

WINSTON-SALEM — Dr. Benjamin Mays, former president of Morehouse College Atlanta, Ga., spoke to over 200 Omega men and their wives recently on "Black Power and White Power" and challenged them to enter wholeheartedly in the struggle to help establish the good society.

He spoke at the Statler Hilton Motor Inn during a breakfast which concluded the annual meeting of the Sixth District of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. Over 275 delegates from North and South Carolina attended the two-day meeting.

"I HAVE often been asked to speak on 'Black Power,'" Dr. Mays said, "but I refuse to speak on 'Black Power' unless I can speak also on 'White Power.' If there had been no 'White Power' badly misused, there would be no

'Black Power,'" he said. Dr. Mays said that when you are talking about 'White Power,' you are talking about that 99 percent of the people of the U. S. who control more than 99 percent of the wealth. "What then is 'Black Power' and how can the black man share in power?" No one knows what it is but it will not be secured by begging and pleading," Dr. Mays said.

"NO GROUP in power is good enough, Christian or democratic enough to share his power out of the goodness of his heart. Socrates was wrong to say that he would.
