## Retired in 1957 After 38 Years, She's Still Teaching in India

Mrs. C. Ruth Edwards retired from the North Carolina College faculty in 1957 after 38 years as a college teacher of voice. Today she is still teaching—in Mysore, India.

After her official retirement, Mrs. Edwards divided her time between nursery school teaching in Durham and visits with her son and his family in Greensboro.

In 1967, when her son, Dr. Gerald Edwards, went to India as a Consultant in the Physical Sciences in the Ohio State University — India Education Project, sponsored by the Agency for International Development, he took his mother along.

While Dr. Edwards, chairman of the department of Chemistry at A&T University, was busy with his work, his mother looked for something to occupy her time. She found just the thing—a job as a music teacher in a Mysore elementary school. She teaches Indian children the songs loved by American youngsters.

Mrs. Edwards holds the Master of Arts degree from Teachers College, Columbia University, with a major in voice and music education. She is a charter member of the North Carolina chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing and was for two years secretary-treasurer of the chapter.

Mrs. Edwards taught at Kittrell College for 12 years and at North Carolina College for 26 years.

She will return to Durham in September, where she maintains a residence.

## Householders To Be Probed About Labor
