

Principal at Madison Twice Lauded by City

MADISON — John W. Dillard, veteran school principal here, has been honored twice this summer by the Madison-Mayodan City School Board.

A brand new elementary school, now under construction and to be ready for occupancy in early October, has been named in his honor, the John W. Dillard Elementary School. The new plant, to be fully integrated, is located immediately adjacent to the Madison-Mayodan High School here.

The announcement was made by V. Mayo Bundy, superintendent of the Madison-Mayodan City Schools.

The building, considered one of the most modern in the State, contains 12 classrooms. An outstanding feature is a circular facility of six classrooms for the primary department which permits usage of rooms from one to all six.

Earlier this summer, Dillard, who had served as principal of the all Negro Charles Drew High School since 1942, was named principal of the newly created junior high school to open in September. The school will serve as the lone institution for junior high pupils in Madison.

A native of Greensboro, Dillard is a graduate of A&T State



University and holds the M.A. degree from Ohio State University. He is married to the former Miss Mabel M. Mayle of Belpre, Ohio. The couple has a daughter.

Presbyterians Begin Scholarship Competition for High Schools

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — The 1969 National Presbyterian College Scholarship competition for high school seniors will begin officially this week, with mailings on August 23 to some 12,000 people most likely to inform high school seniors of the scholarship opportunity.

The list includes 10,000 United Presbyterian ministers and other church staffers and 2,000 high school guidance counselors.

The mailing includes the 1969 National Presbyterian College Scholarship folder, which includes the application form.

To be eligible for the competition, young people must be communicant members of the United Presbyterian Church who will be college freshmen in the fall of 1969 and intend to enter one of the 46 colleges related to the Board of Christian Education;

who will be graduated from secondary school in January or June, 1969 and who ranked in the top quarter of their secondary school class at the end of the junior year.

There are now 196 National Presbyterian College Scholars studying in 36 United Presbyterian-related colleges scattered across the U.S.A.

Colleges enrolling the largest number of scholarship winners this year are: The College of Wooster, Wooster, Ohio; Macalester College, St. Paul, Minn.; Wilson College, Chambersburg, Penn.; Occidental College, Los Angeles, California; Lewis and Clark College, Portland, Oregon; Trinity University, San Antonio, Texas.

Students qualify for the competition by filling out and mailing the scholarship application form to reach Philadelphia not later than December 2.

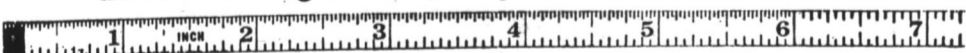

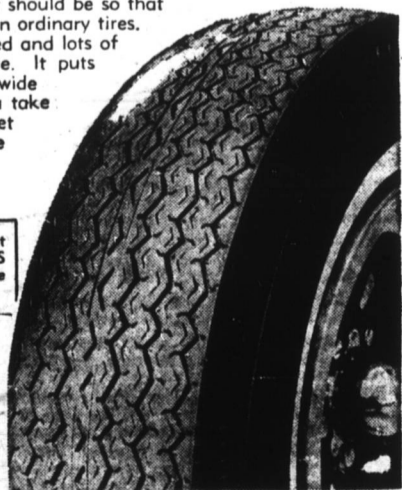
