

Oceanographer Completes Year As Congressional Affairs Fellow

James H. Hannaham, a top-ranking Negro member of the Oceanographer of the Navy's Staff, has just completed a year as a Fellow in Congressional Affairs and Policy Documentation.

Hannaham was nominated for the Fellowship by the Navy Department and selected by the U. S. Civil Service Commission and the American Political Science Association, who are the sponsors of the program. The purpose of the Fellowships is to provide an opportunity for some of the most promising young federal executives to acquire a thorough understanding of congressional operations.

During his year as a Congressional Fellow, Hannaham did staff work for Congressman Richard T. Hanna of California and Senator Claiborne Pell of Rhode Island. While with Senator Pell, Hannaham worked on issues related to poverty and Congressional and Administration reactions to the Southern Christian Leadership Conference's Poor Peoples Campaign. He also helped develop legislative proposals which might encourage greater participation by the poor in the political mainstream of America.

National 4-H Club Week Set October 6-12

More than 75,000 Tar Heel 4-H members will join hands as three million youth in 50 states and Puerto Rico observe National 4-H Club Week, Oct. 6-12.

The 4-H'ers have chosen the theme, "4-H - A World of Opportunity," points out Dr. T. C. Blalock, state 4-H leader at North Carolina State University. "Our focus is to expand 4-H to all boys and girls, ages 9 to 19, regardless of cultural, racial or economic background," he said.

"We are just completing another year of 4-H work, and it is only appropriate that we try to reach others through our program," Blalock emphasized. "The 4-H program helps members choose projects or 'everyday learning experiences' that fit them and the places where they live. They learn why's as well as how's in strengthening science," he reported.

Some of the other purposes of the special observance are to encourage more young men and women to volunteer as 4-H leaders; to recognize the important contributions of parents; and to tell the public about the program's accomplishments.

In 1966, he was given the Navy Meritorious Civil Service Award, one of the highest honors in the Navy Incentive Awards Program, for his consistently high quality performance on the Oceanographer's Staff.

Born in Pittsburgh, Pa., and raised in Brooklyn, N. Y., Hannaham is married, the father of one, and resides in Washington, D. C.

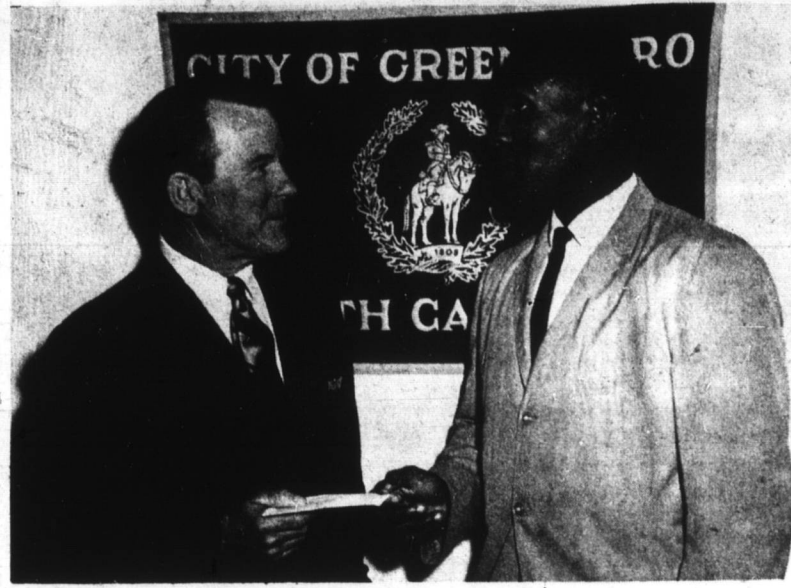
The Office of the Oceanographer of the Navy, commanded by Rear Admiral O. D. Waters, Jr., was set in August of 1966 to administer all U. S. Navy oceanographic programs. To assist the Oceanographer in his mission, the Chief of Naval Research, Rear Admiral Thomas B. Owen, is Assistant Oceanographer for Ocean Engineering. A third assistant who will handle operational production in direct support of the Fleet is yet to be named.

Decorating Idea

Home Heating Systems Match Decor



From an interior decorator's viewpoint, the best heating system is an invisible one. At second best, he hopes for an inconspicuous one. Most decorators suggest that with just a little planning early in remodeling or new construction, unsightly radiators and wall registers can be eliminated. 3M Company heating specialist Richard Reitz confirms that radiators can be hidden with covers which are functional as well as attractive. Baseboard heaters are less noticeable when furniture is positioned in a way which blocks them from view but does not impair their performance. Forced air outlets can be painted to match the walls and indirect lighting can be installed to emphasize other areas in the room. If the house is to be heated electrically, a new electric radiant heating panel product is available for installation directly in ceilings, flush with standard ceiling materials. Panels are thermostatically controlled to heat objects in the room when the room's temperature falls below a prescribed level. Since panels are overhead and can be painted to match the ceiling, they are seldom noticed. This also frees floor space and permits greater flexibility for furniture and drapery placement. A combination of ceiling and baseboard units can also be installed to increase design and decorating flexibility.

ANSWERS TO TURKEY QUESTIONS

Q. How do you recommend thawing a frozen turkey so it may be stuffed?

A. The frozen unstuffed turkey may be thawed in the original moisture-proof wrapping in the refrigerator. Or, the wrapped bird may be placed in a pan of cold water for faster thawing. Change water frequently.

Q. What is the advantage of a deep basted turkey?

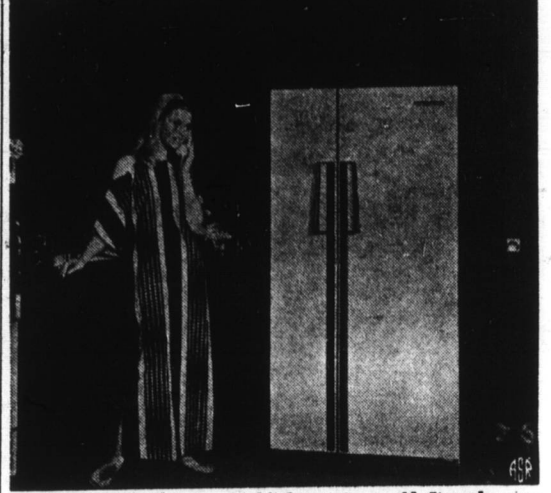
