While with Senator Pell, Hannaham. worked on issues related to poverty and Congressional and Administration reactions to the Southern Christian Leadership Conference's Poor Peoples Campaign. He also helped develop legislative proposals which might encourage greater participation by the poor in the political mainstream of Amer-
