



Durham Man Returns to City From Africa

Charles Kenyatta, the former Charles Morris, who spent most of his young life here in Durham, has returned to his old hometown in order to write a book "From Muslim to Mau Mau . . . In Cold Blood" on the experiences which he has undergone and the philosophy which he has developed since leaving home many years ago. The book has been commissioned by another Durham celebrity, Floyd McKissick, National Executive Director of the Committee on Racial Equality. McKissick, under the banner of his new project, Floyd McKissick Enterprises, Inc., has just purchased a New York publishing company, Thunder and Lightning Publishers, and Kenyatta's book will be the first publication issued by the new company.

Kenyatta, who was known as Charles 37X when he was the chief security man for Malcolm X during the time of his affiliation with the Black Muslim movement and afterward, is the organizer and head of the Harlem Mau Mau and has just returned to America from Biafra, Africa where he was the first Black American to enter and leave that country since the beginning of the civil conflict.

The Bulls started off cold and at the end of the first quarter the Panthers were well ahead with a score of 21-13. At half time the score was 38-24 with the Panthers out in front with a 14 point lead. Coach Johnny Moses roused his Bulls at half time and in the third quarter with 1:02 showing on the clock the score was tied at 51-51.
