

During Lock-in of Trustees Below is a text of the letter of resignation submitted by Morehouse College President, Dr. Hugh M. Gloster, who refused to participate in negotiations under duress with a group of Atlanta University Center students during their lock-in of Morehouse Board of

Trustees on April 18 and 19: I am in favor of increased black membership on the Board of Trustees of Morehouse College and of closer relationships among the six institutions in the Atlanta University Center, but I cannot participate in a meeting in which members of the Board of Trustees are confined in this conference room by force and are subjected to insult and intimidation. Moreover, I cannot sign any document or vote on any motion presented in such a meeting on this day when my office has been broken into and occupied.

Since I cannot be a party to concessions made under duress to a group of ten individuals including one student from Clark, one student from Morris Brown, three students from Morehouse, and four students and a teacher from Spelman and supported by a Morehouse teacher and about forty Atlanta University Center students who have locked this conference room and taken over this building, I am herewith submitting my resignation as President of Morehouse College, effective on a date to be agreed upon by the Board and myself.

Please let me thank the Board, the Faculty, the Student Body, the Alumni, and other friends of this institution for the counsel and cooperation extended to me from the time of my appointment to
