NCCU Will Have \$409,000 to Pay Workers

North Carolina Central University will have \$409,210 to pay student employees in 1970-71 under the federal work study program, according to W. C. Blackwell, financial aid director.

Work-study grants and loans account for most of the financial aid at the university. Blackwell said his office tries to develop a package program so

that most students receive financial aid as direct grants, work-study grants, and loans. Students receiving work-study grants are granted specific amounts at the beginning of the school year, but must work up to 15 hours per week to qualify for the funds.

The funds are provided under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, Blackwell said.
