WOODLAND HILLS, Calif - Twenty-three-yearold Hedgemon Lewis is itching for a chance to fight world welterweight champion Napoles.

But the youthful number four ranked contender, from Los Angeles is going to have to get more of a test in future matches than he did at the Valley Music Theater.

LEWIS, 143, came back from a six-month layoff to score an easy knockout at 2:06 of the third round of a scheduled 10rounder with Ricky Ortiz, 147, New York.

It was little more than a brisk workout for Lewis, who lost his last hout in September when he was knocked out in the 10th round by Ernie "Indian Red" Lopez at the Los Angeles Sports Arena.

It was a different story as Lewis had Ortiz on the canvas four times - once in the first twice in the second and once early in the third - before referee Bobby Rings stepped in between the two fighters while the winner was banging away at will and his opponent was cowering against the ropes. Ortiz offered little argu-


