

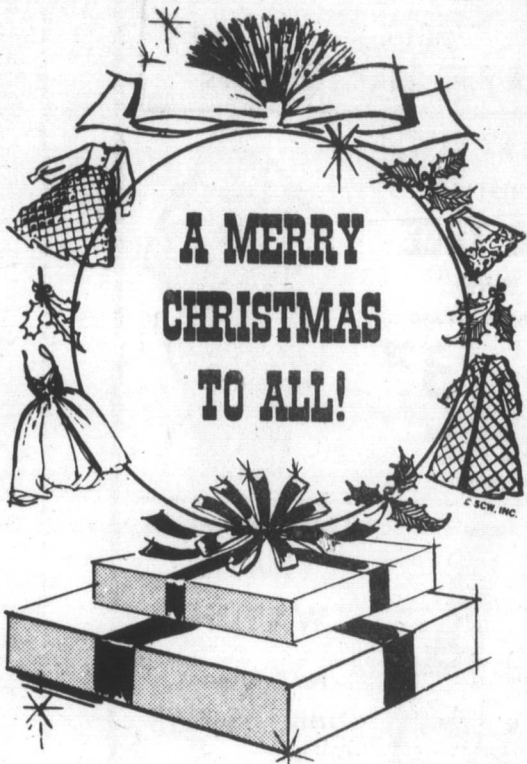
U. S. POST OFFICES TO CLOSE FOR NEW YEAR'S DAY, JANUARY 1

Post offices will observe the following holiday schedule on New Year's Day, Friday, January 1, 1971. There will be no regular window, delivery or collection service. However, special delivery service will be provided.

In many cities, post office lobbies will be open for mail deposit and purchase of stamps from self-service machines. Lock box service will

be provided on a community need basis. Delivery and collection services will be in effect on Saturday, January 2. Window service will be provided on a local need basis in each community.

Normal Sunday service will be in effect on Sunday, January 3. There will be collection, lock box and special delivery services.
