Smoking Law To Be Repealed

LANSING, Mich. State Rep. Bert C. Brennan said he will introduce a bill to repeal a 1915 law prohibiting cigarette smoking by persons under 21 and an 1889 law forbidding the use of tobacco by persons under 17. Brennan said he didn't want to encourage smoking by anyone but the 1915 law "seems ridiculous in light of present conditions and enforcement practices."




