GREENSBORO - Social cubs have been granted an ex-
tension of time until May 15 to file returns on their unrelated business income, Dis trict Director,
nounced today
This year, for the first time, report and pay tax on certain income, including income from investments and from
dealings with nonmembers. The ordinary due date for this report is March 15 for social clubs operating on
calendar year basis. However calendar year bacis. However.
the IRS recognizes the problems of social clubs in determining the proper information to be filed, especially since regulations on the subject have not yet been issued. For that reason, the time for
