**Noted Author, Phi Beta Kappa's Honor's Day Speaker April 22**

ALBANY, Ga. — Dr. Darwin T. Turner, an English scholar and well-known author, will be the keynote speaker for the annual observance of Honors Day at Albany (Ga.) State College on Thursday, April 22.  
 The annual Honors Day Program, which is held in Sanford Hall Auditorium, is the occasion for saluting those students who have achieved success academically during the school year.  
 Dr. Charles K. Dunson, head of the department of mathematics at Albany State, is chairman of the Honors Day Committee. According to him, some 300 Albany State students will be singled out for academic honors and achievement on this special program.  
 Dr. Turner, a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Cincinnati where he received the B. A. degree in English, is currently a professor of English on the University of Michigan faculty. Prior to accepting that post in 1970, he was professor of English and Dean of the Graduate School at North Carolina A. & T. State University.  
 Turner, an author of several books, earned the M.A. degree at the University of Cincinnati where his thesis was Negro American Prose Fiction Writers of the Twentieth Century. His Ph.D. degree in English was conferred by the University of Chicago in 1956.  
 The Cincinnati, Ohio native's teaching experience include stints at Clark College, Morgan State College, Florida A. & M. University, where he chaired the department of English, and North Carolina A.&T. State University, where he worked for 13 years in the capacities of English professor, chairman of the department of English and dean of the Graduate School.  
 A Phi Beta Kappa at the University of Cincinnati, where he graduated at the age of 16, Dr. Turner holds membership in several learned societies and a number of professional organizations. He has also lectured at Duke University, the University of Texas, University of Cincinnati and the University of Arkansas.  
 Turner spent a year on a fellowship in the North Carolina-Duke Universities Co-operative Program for research in Afro-American Literature. He has also held a study grant in 1965, for the American Council of Learned Societies for research in the writings of Jean Toomer.
