"busing", as an ultimate end in itself. For the Nixon Administration, "desegregation" throughout the South has often meant the closing of black schools, the demoting of black Frederick Douglass High School to Jefferson Davis.

Dr. Abernathy expressed hope that the Supreme Court's decision is a stepping stone to establishing a universal principle that American children have a right to the best education that the country can possible give.

In a multi-racial society, there are a vast wealth of experiences to be shared by the total population. Consequently, integration or desegregation is not a one way process.
