NEW YORK — For the past three years Lucretia Taylor has been involved in the Sisterhood, an organization dedicated to the propagation of Black awareness, Black selfhood, Black dignity, and Black unity. Through this organization she has attempted to add a new dimension to life at Western College and at the same time provide a vehicle for the mutual understanding and cooperation of all segments of the community for their common good. The Sisterhood has also attempted to provide a base for Black students to move into the mainstream of campus life as smoothly and effectively as possible.

As a member of "The Ensemble," an equivalent of an Arts Ensemble, specializing in interpretive dance, dramatic reading, and writing and reciting poetry, Lucretia appeared at several college functions in Ohio and a performance for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference Convention held in Cincinnati last year. Her group also participates in Miami University's Black Theatre Workshop, which last term presented Douglas Turner Ward's "The Happy Ending," a

sociological satire, in which Lucretia had a co-starring role.

In her Freshman year Lucretia appeared in the Western College production of Lerol Jones' "The Dutchman" and the following year was the assistant director of Ionesco's "The Lesson." Lucretia also wrote and directed a short playlet depicting certain aspects of the Black experience in contemporary America.

This past summer Lucretia worked as student assistant in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Under their auspices she co-chaired a project initiated by the Office of Youth and Student Affairs, Washington, D. C., designed to discover ways of establishing better relations between the federal government and the student community. She sent out questionnaires to over fifty colleges and universities in the region and visited sixteen campuses, talking with students, faculty members, and administrators. Her report — "The University: Chaos or Community" — was warmly received by the Department. For her work she received cash awards and citations.

cial services of the U.S. Office of Education, made the remarks at commencement exercises of Elizabeth City State University.

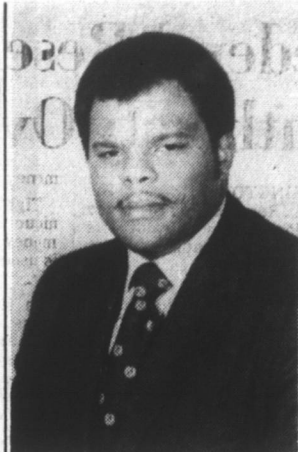

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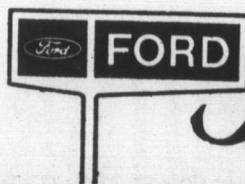
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
