

The Queen is a small woman, and Debbie is a rather tall girl, therefore, making an interesting looking couple to begin with. The Queen started to put Debbie's medal over her head, around her neck, when she got the catch in the ribbon caught in Debbie's hair. Being a mother herself, the Queen did not panic in the least. She simply asked Debbie to lean closer, stretched, looked, and finally managed to lower the medal around Debbie's neck. It was Debbie's first international competition and she was a bit shaken by the whole matter." In 1968 at the Olympics in

Mexico City, Casey was having transportation problems. The place she was staying was across the city from the stadium, and every time she tried to get a bus back to her hotel, she could never find one headed that way. The Olympic Village, where the athletes and judges were staying was only two blocks away, however, and Casey came up with a unique way of getting to the games.
