HUD, TSU Use Black College Resources To Aid Commun.

The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development today signed a contract with Texas Southern University of Houston, Texas, to find new ways to utilize the resources of black colleges in fostering community development activities.
 Texas Southern, a predominantly black college with more than 6,000 students, is the first institution to receive a national contract as the result of recommendations of black colleges formulated at a HUD-sponsored conference in February, 1971.

TSU is situated in the model neighborhood impact area in Houston. The \$135,000 contract covers a 13-month period starting April 1. In addition to these funds, other Federal agencies have been encouraged to participate in aiding the predominantly black college to increase its urban involvement. The contract brings with it an additional \$70,000 commitment of funds from the Office of Education in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and the HUD Community Planning and Management Office.
 This contract brings the level of TSU's involvement with the Model Cities program in Houston to more than \$1 million in Federal and local funds.
 Signing the contract today were Floyd H. Hyde, HUD Assistant Secretary for Community Development, and Dr. Granville M. Sawyer, President of Texas Southern University.
 Specific aims of the program are:
 To halt the urban decay that surrounds the university by utilizing the institution's expansion plan as a community development program;
 To mobilize the broad resources of the university to complement the efforts of local government in the local Model Cities program.
 To train and mobilize neighborhood youth and college students to assist in community development projects;
 To make available university personnel as technical assistants to community groups active in the Model Cities program;

H. R. Sims of Urban League Joins Johnson & Johnson
 NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J. — Harold R. Sims, acting executive director of the National Urban League, has been named director of Corporate Affairs for Johnson & Johnson, the worldwide manufacturer of medical, consumer and industrial products.
 Mr. Sims, 36, joins Johnson & Johnson after three years at the National Urban League. When Whitney M. Young, Jr. died in March, 1971, Mr. Sims was named acting executive director.
 President Richard M. Nixon recently commended Mr. Sims on his leadership of the National Urban League in a letter stating: "I congratulate you on your important contributions to the organization, and I thank you for the profound service you have done our nation in keeping the spirit of Whitney Young alive."
 At Johnson & Johnson, Mr. Sims initially will be involved in developing and implementing minority and urban affairs programs.
 Commenting on his decision to join the company, Mr. Sims said he felt "Johnson & Johnson's well-defined sense of social responsibility and its pioneering role in enlightened management and product integrity create an environment that will enable me to work toward goals I believe all business should be striving for in today's society."
 Serving in the United States Army from 1957 to 1967, Mr. Sims attained the rank of major and was the first black officer assigned as secretary to the General Staff. He played a major role in expanding equality of opportunity for the black soldier and helped to shape the Department of Defense's open housing policy for servicemen.
 Prior to joining the Urban League, Mr. Sims was executive secretary to Sargent Shriver, director, Office of Economic Opportunities, from 1967 to 1969.
