voter registration in the South.

The VEP statistics document that, in every state with the exception of Arkansas, the percentage of white registration is larger than the percentage of black registration. Extreme examples are Alabama, where whites are registered at a rate of 78.52% but black registration is only 54.68%, and North Carolina, where 60.60% of the whites are registered as compared to only 44.38% black registration.

Overall in the South, the average rate of voting-age whites registered to vote is 64.97% as compared to the black rate of 58.61%. In Arkansas, 80.89% of voting-age blacks are registered as compared with 61.39% for whites of voting age.

John Lewis, Executive Director of the VEP, stated, "We must keep in mind that these statistics were the most reliable estimates available at the beginning of this year. Since that time, we have recognized the enormity of the task before us and have made an all-out effort to register the potential two and one-half million black voters in the South."

"At the present time," Lewis continued, "we are providing more allocations for voter registration to local groups in the 11 southern states than at any other time in our ten-year history."
