

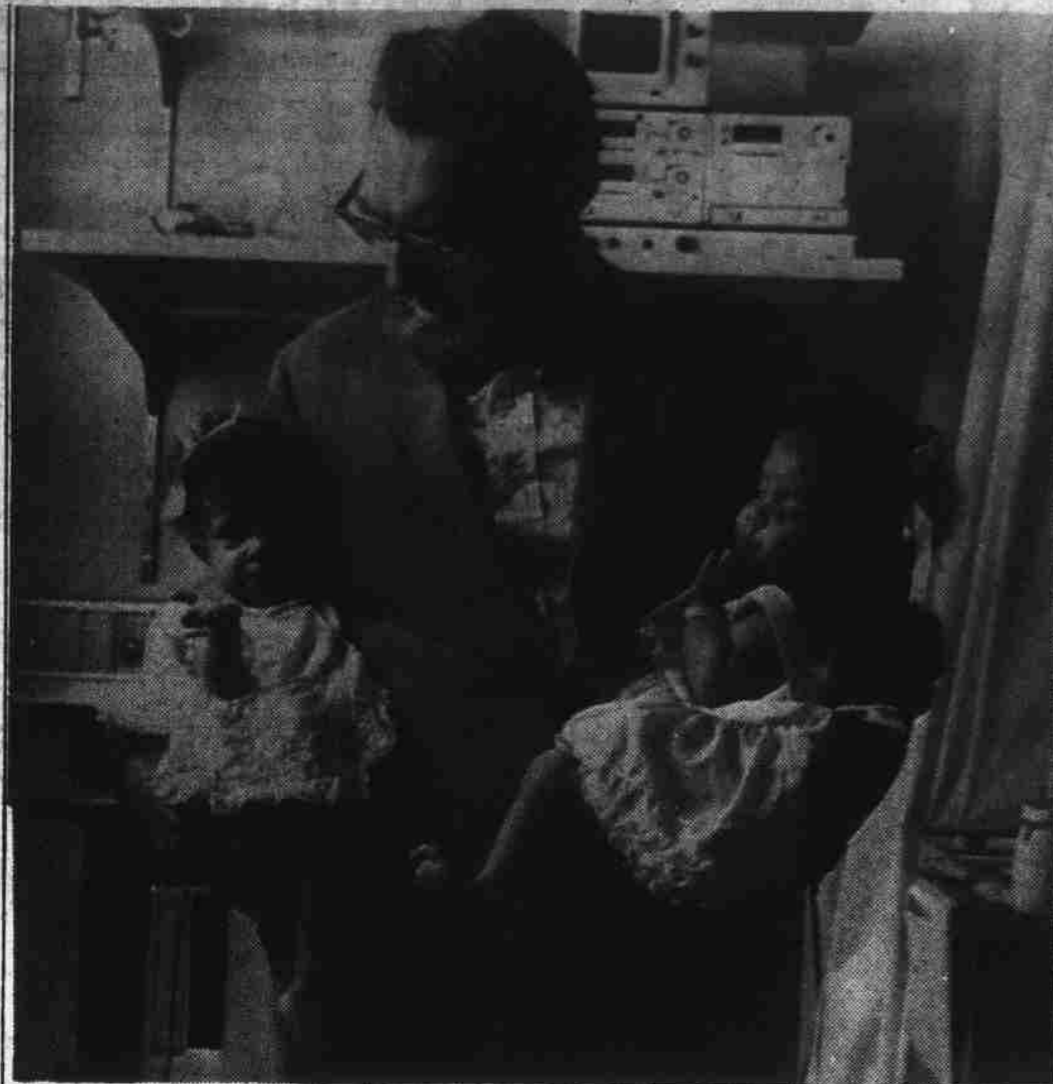

Drinks Too Much
 Recently, I have received a number of letters concerning problem drinking. While some alcohol consumption is acceptable, excessive drinking is not only bad for your health, but your home life and career as well. I shouldn't have to tell you about the dangers involved in drinking and drinking. But did you know that excessive alcohol consumption can even ruin your sex life? Sure, total abstinence is one answer, but a difficult and drastic one, since reasonable social drinking is very much a part of most people's lifestyle. The answer then is moderation. A way of controlling how much liquor you drink; knowing how to limit your daily intake. If, for example, you go to a bar every night after work, try and arrive an hour later or leave an hour earlier than usual. Use the excuse that your doctor ordered you to cut down. If you drink at home, measure out your proper daily intake. Put it in a separate bottle and lock the rest away. This way you won't just be casually pouring.
