to the method one might use in compiling the necessary records for the 1974 return. First, get out a copy of last year's return to make sure that no recurring deductions are being overlooked. Other common deductions are often overlooked - such as the travel cost of taking a job-related college course after work and the cost of storing income-producing property (stocks, bonds, etc.) in a safe-deposit box. Union dues and dues to professional societies are also deductible.
