

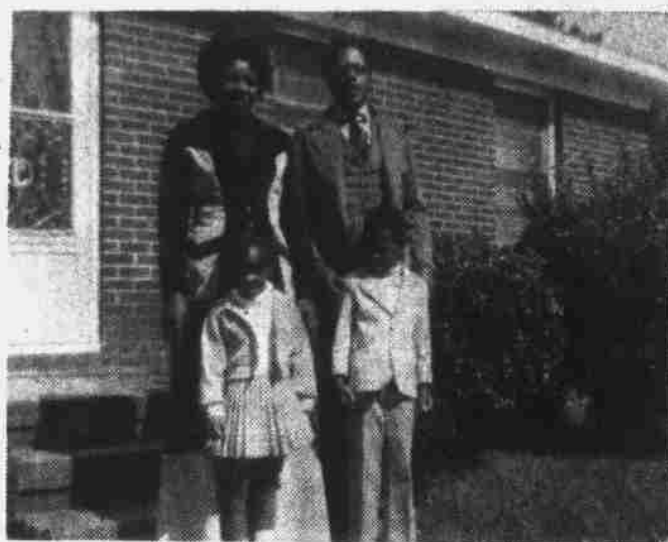
### Triangle Circle Holds Xmas Dinner

### Mr. and Mrs. A. T. Spaulding Return From Liberia

Mr. and Mrs. A. T. Spaulding, Sr., of Durham have returned from Monrovia, Liberia, where Spaulding was the "Personal Representative of the President of the United States" and head of the United States Delegation to the Inauguration of President William R. Tolbert, Jr., and Vice President James C. Greene, of the Republic of Liberia, January 4-7.

Ambassador Spaulding presented to President Tolbert a letter from President Ford, also a gift from the President, on behalf of the Government and the American people. The United States Delegation had a private meeting with President Tolbert on Tuesday, January 6 at 10:30 a.m. when important matters of common interest to our two countries were discussed.

Ambassador and Mrs. Spaulding returned through Washington to report to the President for the Delegation and to make presentations from President Tolbert to President Ford.

A movie, "Legacy of a Dream," is scheduled at 7 p.m. in the Alfonso Elder Student Union. Music by the NCCU Pentecostal Fellowship Choir is scheduled, under the direction of Karen Hamlet. Mrs. Barnes said the theme for the 1976 memorial observance is "Martin Luther King in Retrospect: Where Do We Go From Here?"
