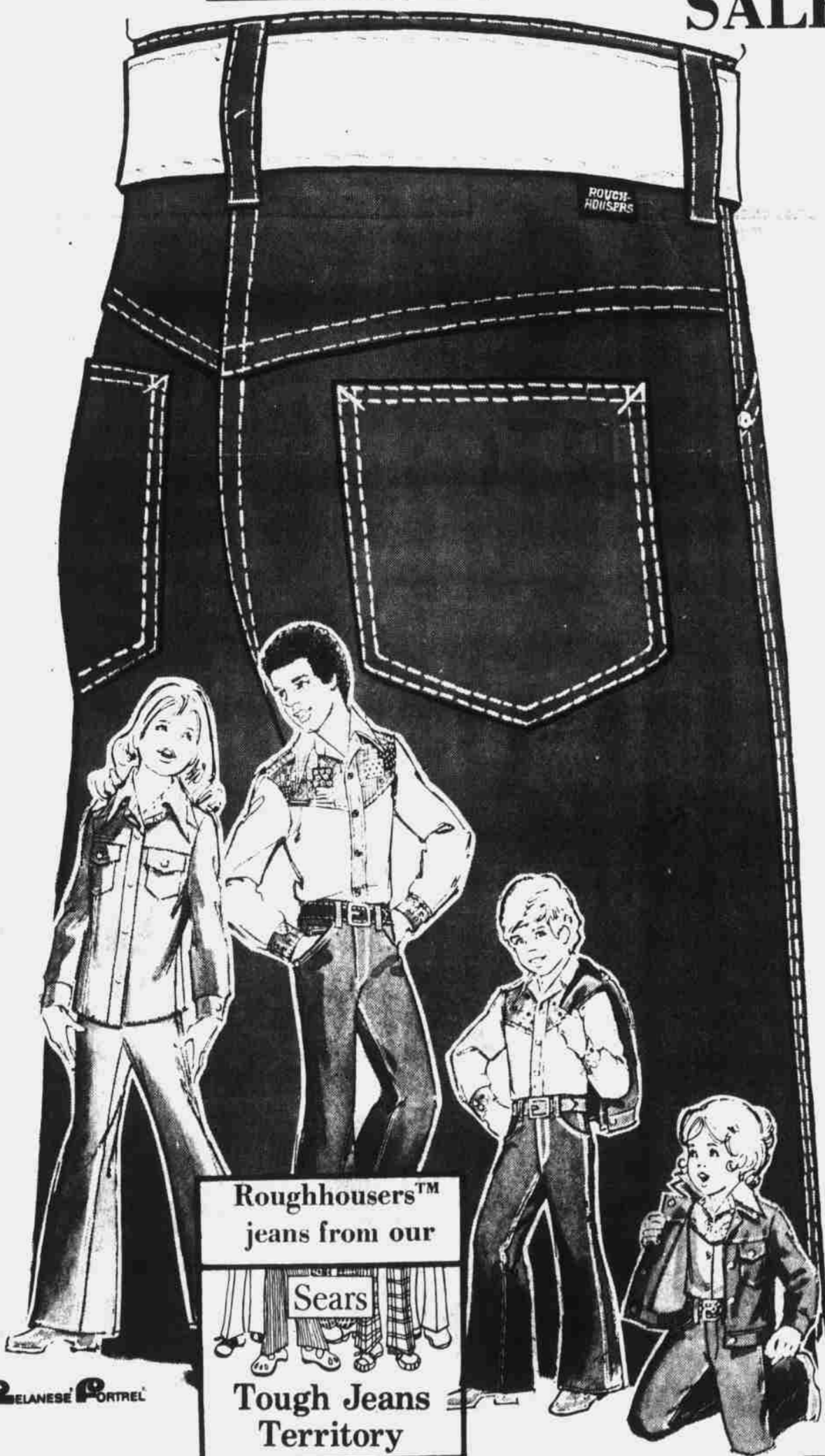

**Bear It**  
Bears along the coasts of Alaska and British Columbia are known as "browns," and those inland as "grizzlies." Brown bears often grow much larger. Male grizzlies reach 600 pounds in some mountain areas, but grow to twice that size when living on the coast. Some of them tower 10-feet in height.
