

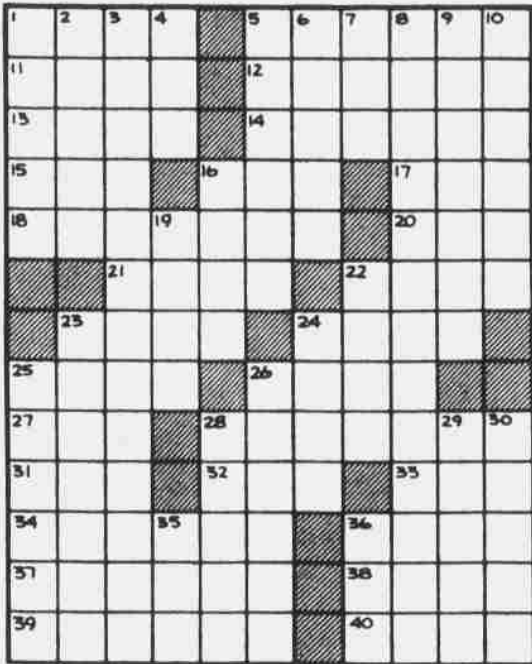

"I got it so bad I can't even sleep when it's time to get up!"

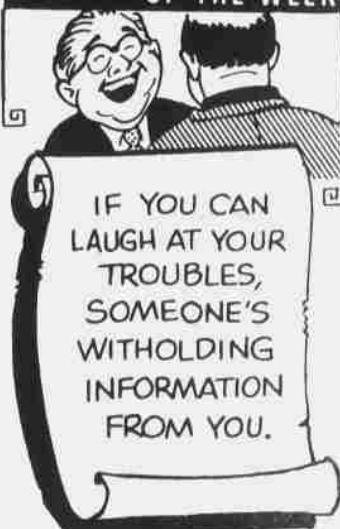
Extra Points

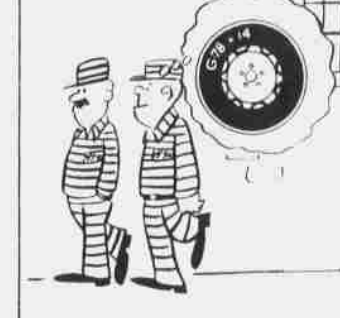
