

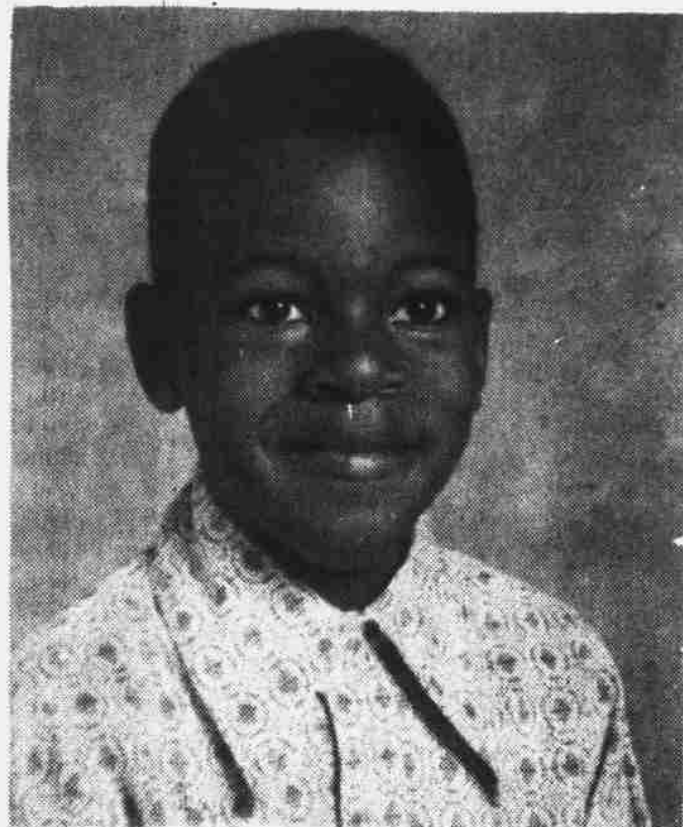

Catherine Annette Page Wins Nat'l Achievement Scholarship

Catherine Annette Page, daughter of Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Page of 123 Masondale Avenue, Durham, has been named the winner of a National Achievement \$1000 Scholarship - a nonrenewable award of \$1,000 which she will receive next fall after enrolling in college. She joins a total of about 535 black students receiving awards in the Twelfth Annual Achievement Program.

Miss Page is editor-in-chief of the school newspaper of Hillside High School, co-chairperson of the Human Relations Committee and Senior Class treasurer. She attended the 1975 North Carolina Governor's School and the 1975 North Carolina Girls' State. Miss Page is a member of the National Honor Society and received the Daughters of the American Revolution Good Citizenship Award.

Miss Page was chosen from among the black students in her geographic region who qualified as Finalists in this year's competition. All winners of National Achievement \$1000 Scholarships were chosen by a committee of professionals in the field of college admissions and counseling. The committee evaluated the records of all

Finalists in the competition and selected as winners those who appear to have the best potential for success.

Over 50,000 black students throughout the nation entered this year's Achievement Program by ranking a qualifying test in 1974 when they were high school juniors. Some 1,450 (the highest scorers in each of seven U. S. geographic regions) were announced as Achievement Program Semifinalists in the fall of 1975. Over 1,000 of these students met additional requirements and advanced to Finalist standing, competing for about 1,335 awards being offered in 1976 that have a total value of over \$1 million. Since the beginning of the

program in 1965, about 4300 Achievement Scholarships worth more than \$12 million have been awarded to promising black students for their higher education.

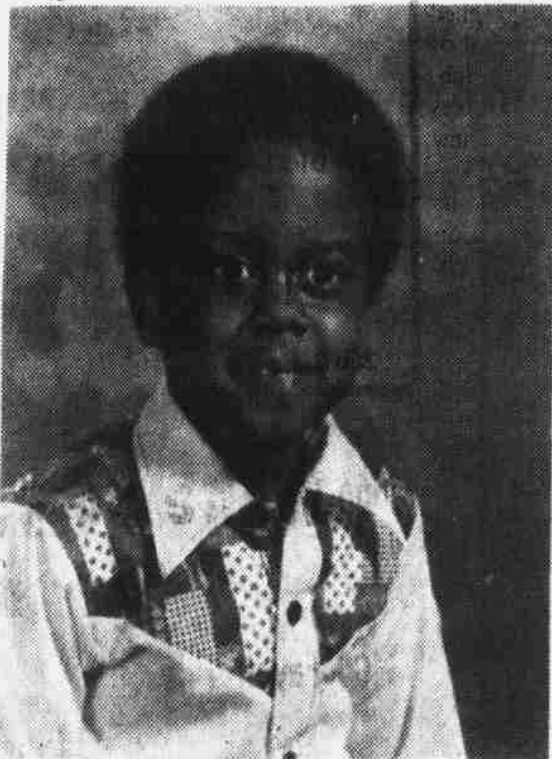
