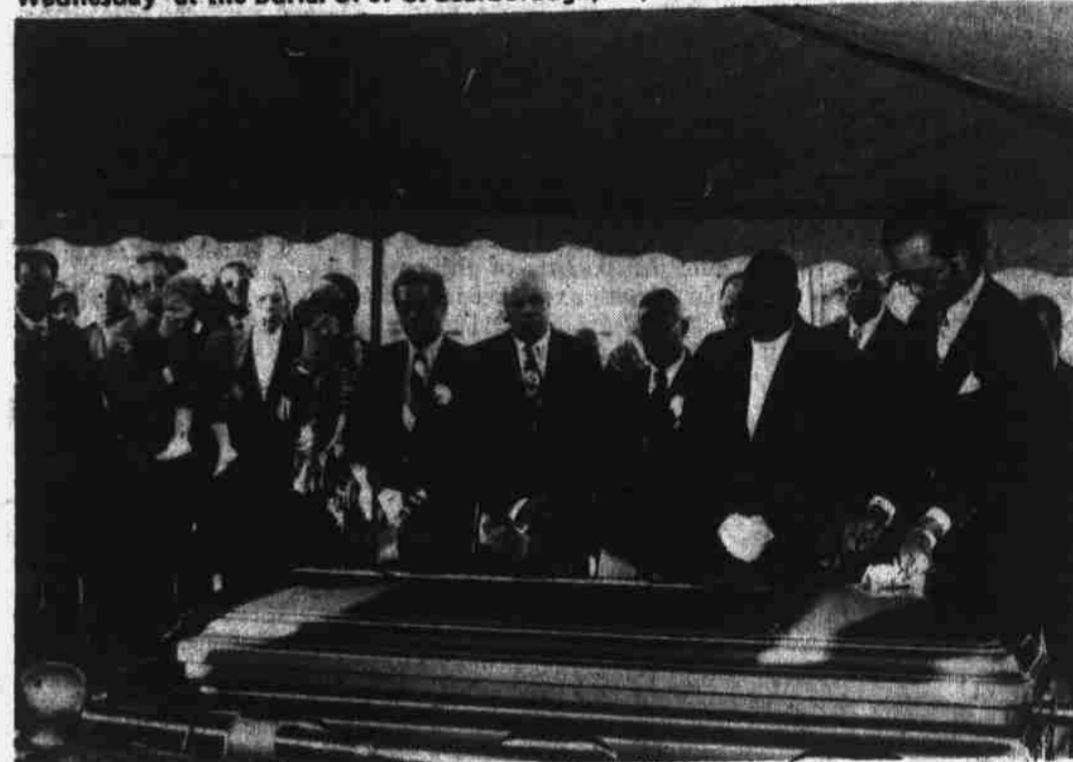
## A PRINCE HAS FALLEN

## Religious Emphasis Week Planned

RALEIGH - Shaw University's annual Religious Emphasis Week will be held Feb. 20-25. The theme for this year will be "Whither Christianity?" The University Minister, Rev. Ronald Swain, has announced exploration of this theme from three aspects: 1) personal/social level, 2) church-related university campus level, and 3) the national level.

Some of the nation's top ministers have been invited to come and share this week with the university family and the community. Rev. Dr. Lorenzo M. Robinson, minister of the Greater Faith Tabernacle Baptist Church in Stamford, Connecticut will deliver the sermon on Sunday, Feb. 20. Rev. William S. Epps, pastor

of the First Baptist Church in Winston, Salem, will deliver the messages on Monday through Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. in the university chapel. Dr. Grady Davis, will be the featured speaker for the third annual faculty-staff luncheon on Thursday, Feb. 24.

The evenings will be filled with opportunities for the community to become involved with the programs. On Monday through Wednesday, at 7:30 p.m. small discussion groups will be formed and reflect on the theme of the day and the preacher's message. These sessions will be held in the Student Union Building on campus.

There will be special features in the activities this year, including a concert on Sun-

day evening at 6:30 p.m., by "The Living Sacrifice", which includes Charles Johnson, a 1975 Shaw graduate, as one of its members. Another feature will be an essay contest developed around this year's theme. Three prizes will be awarded based on the judgment of faculty members of the English department.

Religious Emphasis Week, an annual affair, is an effort to provide various opportunities for inquiry into issues of current concern, both to the university family and to the general community. All sessions are open and free, with the general public urged to attend and become a part of the week's activities.

The flamingo garden is one of 15 distinctive gardens in the Southern Living Show designed for varying lifestyles.

There will be a four room Celanese House/South, fifteen room settings will be designed by professional interior designers and a unique ASID products display will show graphically how high fashion influences home furnishings.

The Charlotte Council of Garden Clubs will present its 29th standard flower show and the Piedmont Carolinas Orchid Society its 6th annual orchid show at the Southern Living Show.

Hundreds of booths will be devoted to horticulture, home buildings and home improvement products, art and crafts, travel and recreational information, lawn and garden equipment, and a shopper's row.

Show hours are 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. every day except Sunday. Sunday's hours are from noon to 6 p.m. For those with a camera in hand the doors will open Sunday at 10 a.m.

Advance tickets are \$2.50 for adults, \$2.00 for youth (10-18) and senior adults (65 and over). Children through age 9, excluding groups, will be admitted free with adults. All tickets will cost 50 cents each more at the door.
