

Carolina Eagle Vault Company To Expand

Carolina Eagle Vault Company is expanding again, this time with a new building on Route 401 in Raleigh. The building, modeled after the home office on Route 150 in Lexington, is designed in a modified French Mansard style.

The company has been serving funeral directors in the state since 1954 with several of the finest product lines within the burial vault industry. In addition to the Lexington and Raleigh locations, they have a Wilmington distribution center, with future sites planned within the state.

R. L. Koontz, president of the corporation, when interviewed recently at the home plant, explained that the new building in Raleigh, a distribution center, is designed for efficiency of operation in order to serve the

Durham-Raleigh area and have an esthetic nature in keeping with the natural setting of the community.

December is a big month for the company, not only with a new location, but also they have just made available the recently announced burial vault, the Earl. Named after the president's dad, the Earl is a concrete, preformed, steel-reinforced, fiberglass lined vault with a lustrous metallic finish available in several colors.

Their other product lines include the nationally recognized Eagle Triplex, which has a triple wall consisting of an inner cement wall with an asphalt center core and an outer wall of concrete.

Koontz, whose name appears in the pages of Who's Who in North Carolina, and who is a licensed funeral director in the state, resides in the Lexington community with his wife, Jean; their sons, Kef, Lee Jr., and Wesley and their daughter, Robin.
