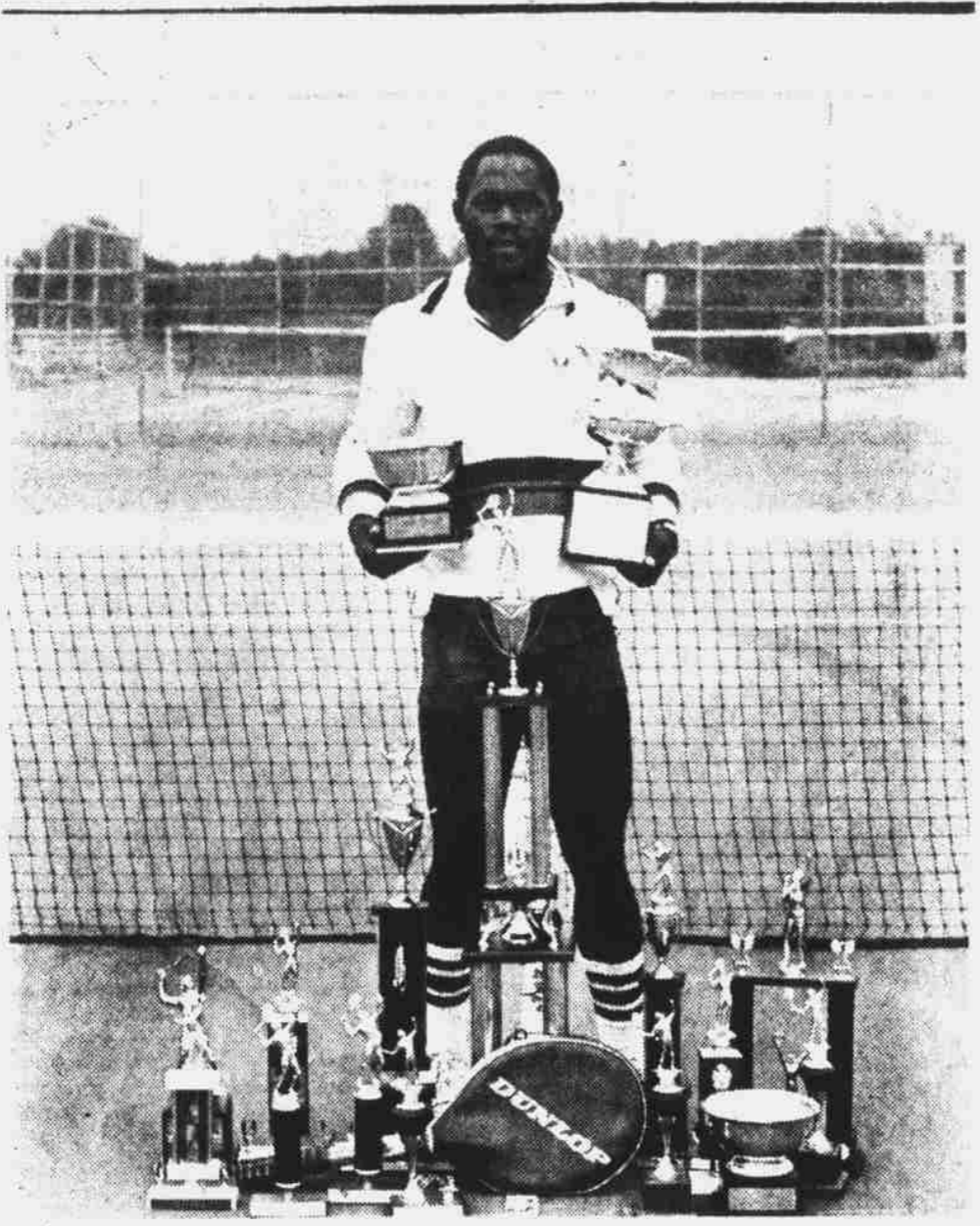

Tony was runner-up in this year's Nigerian Open losing to fellow Countryman Imonite in the finals.

### Eagles Hit The Road Again

The North Carolina Central Eagles basketball team (3-6) return from their 17 day layoff when they travel to St. Paul's College (4-4) in Lawrenceville, Va. on Monday, January 7 and defending CIAA champs Virginia Union on Thursday, January 10.

The Eagles won their last contest 98-87 in the consolation game of the Holiday Festival Tournament held in Winston-Salem. In that contest, John McCall led the Eagles with 22 points, Donald Sinclair had 20 points and 16 assists, David Binion 20 points and Audwin Saunders 20 points.

They are led by junior guard Donald Sinclair (15.1). Other double figure scorers for Central are senior forward Audwin Saunders (13.6), sophomore forward David Binion (13.6) and senior guard John McCall (10.0). Binion leads the Eagles in rebounding with a 9.4 average.

### DelState Hosts Annual Wrestling Invitational

DOVER, DEL — Delaware State College will host the fourth annual Delaware State Wrestling Invitational Tournament, Saturday, January 5 beginning with preliminary rounds at 11 a.m. in Memorial Hall Gymnasium. Consolation finals will begin at 5:30 p.m., followed by the championship round.

Teams competing in addition to Delaware State are last year's defending champs Central Connecticut, Rutgers of Camden, Univ. of Pittsburgh-Johnstown, Virginia Commonwealth, Norfolk State, Southern Connecticut and Salisbury State.

Delaware State, 3-3 this season, placed fourth in the invitational last year. They feature defending champion Shelton at 190 pounds and heavyweight David Crocker. Smith and Crocker are 6-0 in individual matches this season.

Other Hornets expected to make a good showing are freshman Gene Short from Milford, Delaware at 142 pounds and Shelbyville, Delaware native Raymond Handy at 177 pounds, each 5-1 so far this season.

Sophomore Ron Finney, 4-1-1, on the year will wrestle at 167.

"These five have played a key part in all our wins," notes DelState head coach Jackie Robinson. "Everyone is doing an outstanding job, and if we stay healthy, we should make a strong showing."

**A New Look at an Old Town**

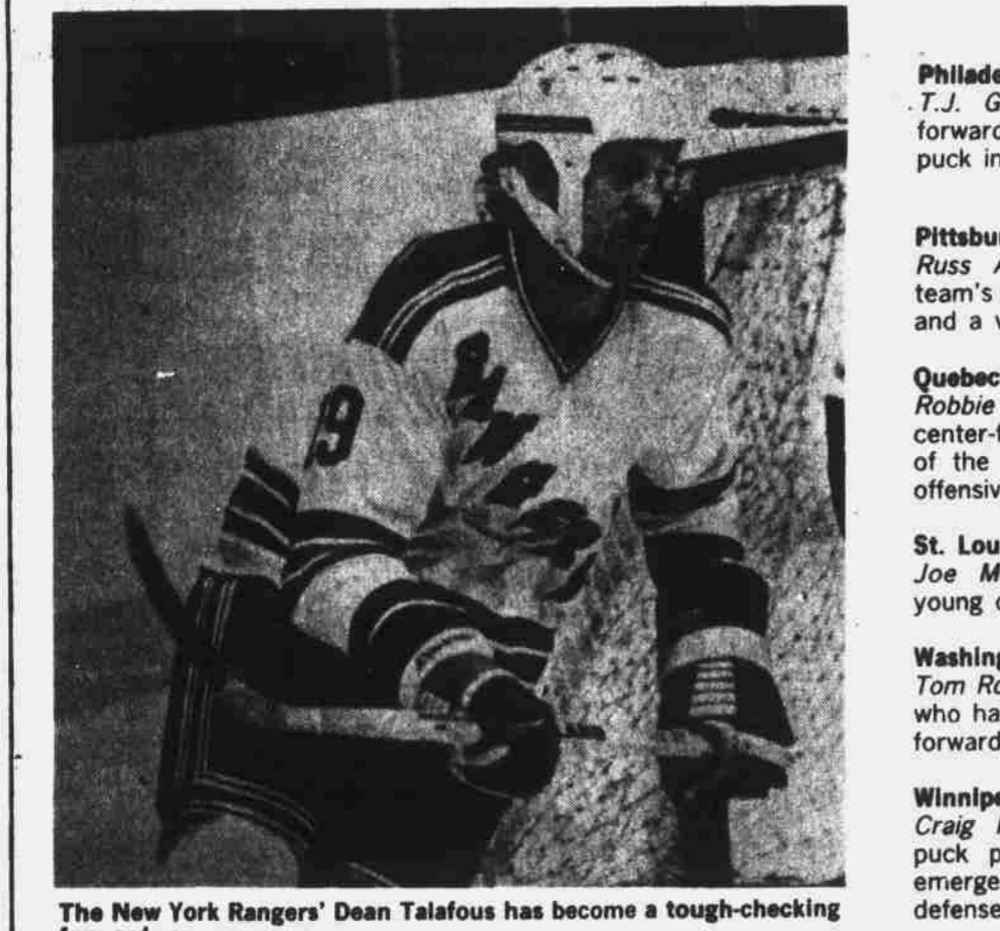
For almost all of its 350 years, it's been known as a great place for culture, entertainment, education and history. Now, Boston is celebrating all those years with Jubilee 350.
